There has been a coordinated effort by countless agencies along the border to provide training and equipment to responders on both sides of the border to better protect our communities. The area in the Ambos Nogales area has been at the forefront of this effort. There has been hundreds of hours of training as

demonstrated on both sides of the border these past two days (March 18 and 19). Various agencies from local to federal have donated thousands of dollars worth of equipment to both sides of the border. Then the region has conducted many exercises from drills to table tops to functional and full scale to prepare for those events that WILL and HAVE occurred along our border. It is during these events that our community has worked together on several occasions to demonstrate the suburb relationship and coordination that exists in this area. INITIAL SCENARIO



It's the morning of March 20th, 2013 and Nogales Sonora has the usual amount of traffic. Many shoppers are in the downtown area.





March 20 – Bi-National Table Top Exercise

At the Port of Entry between Nogales, Sonora and Nogales,



Arizona. It is a typical day with a significant amount of both vehicular and pedestrian traffic moving across the border. At the pedestrian crossing there are approximate 150 people waiting in line and traffic is backed up




approximately a half mile from the gate. It can be up to a 45 minute wait to get.....

It is 8:30am, three railcars carrying sulfuric acid tankers crashed through the border railroad gate. According to unofficial sources, the railcars somehow got unhooked

from a train about seven miles south of the United States/ Mexico border.

This is the scenario for the Exercise attended by 65 Individuals from various Agencies.





The exercise was again a joint effort by many agencies on both sides of the border from local to state to federal. As with any exercise there were many actions that all agencies need to be

commended on but there are always lessons learned. All the agencies are looking forward to the After Action Report that will be produced. A unique activity that was added to this table top was to have a Policy Board Table as the exercise was being conducted. City officials from both sides of the border learned quite a bit of what is expected of them in a situation of this magnitude.

As in the day before there were several agencies from both sides of the border that participated. It was not unusual to have the directors of the State of Sonora and State of Arizona Emergency Management present. Their presence



has been observed in many of the exercises conducted in the



Nogales area over the years. This table top again shows the excellent relationships that have been developed by the various agencies in the area.
