## FY12 Assessment, Revolving Loan Fund, and Cleanup Grant Guidelines Coming Soon!

These grants may be used to assess and cleanup brownfields sites contaminated by petroleum and hazardous substances. Opportunities for funding will include Assessment Grants, Revolving Loan Fund and Cleanup (ARC) Grants. When the guidelines are released, they will be available online here FY12 ARC grant guidelines. - Three western region tribal response programs are highlighted in the latest edition of the "State and Tribal Response Program Highlights" (p.2-3). Read about how the Southern Ute Tribe; the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians; and the Tohono O'odham Nation Tribal Response/Brownfields Programs are addressing brownfields.
- The City of Denver utilized EPA's support with a Targeted Brownfields Assessment to conduct due diligence and reduce environmental uncertainty via Phase I and II environmental assessments and a \$200,000 cleanup grant at Dahlia Square. Now construction is underway for affordable senior housing apartments at Dahlia Square. Read more.
