This is in response to your letter of February 5, 1997, in which you requested an interpretation regarding the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) Good Laboratory Practice Standards ((;LPS). Specifically, you asked whether storage stability studies fell under full GLPS applicability as stated at 40 CFR 160.135(a). You stated that some of your clients had been informed that storage stability studies (EPA Product Chemistry Guideline 63-17) were subject only to partial GLPS as described at 40 CE 160.135(b).

The GLPS state at 40 CFR 160.135(a) that all provisions of the GLP standards shall apply to physical and chemical characterization studies designed to determine stability... "Storage stability studies are considered to fall into the category of stability studies. Therefore the full standards apply to storage stability studies.
