

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and GULF OIL LIMITED PARTNERSHIP, headquartered at 90 Everett Avenue, Chelsea, Massachusetts (Respondent).

## Preliminary Statement

1. On June 10, 1996, a Notice of Violation (NOV) was issued to Respondent alleging that Respondent had violated § 211 of the Clean Air Act (the Act), 42 U.S.C. § 7545, and the regulations promulgated thereunder at 40 CFR Part 80. The NOV stated that an EPA inspection on May 1, 1995 of Gulf Oil's Linden, New Jersey terminal found that gasoline was being sold and offered for sale which had a Reid vapor pressure (RVP) in excess of the applicable standard of 8.3 psi and that, as Distributor of this gasoline, Respondent was liable for this violation. The NOV further stated that the statutory civil penalty is Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) per day for each such violation plus the amount of economic benefit or savings resulting from the violation pursuant to § 211(d) of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7545(d).



- 2. After considering the gravity of the violation and Respondent's history of compliance with the Act, EPA proposed in the NOV a civil penalty of Twenty-Seven Thousand Forty Four Dollars (\$27,044.00).
- 3. The parties, desiring to settle and resolve this matter, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, which consideration is acknowledged by the parties to be adequate, agree as set forth herein.

## Terms of Agreement

- 4. The parties agree that the settlement of this matter is in the public interest and that this Agreement is the most appropriate means of resolving the matter.
- 5. The parties stipulate and agree to the following facts. It is further agreed that these stipulations are applicable to this Agreement and any proceeding arising out of this Agreement or the subject matter of this Agreement.
- a. At all relevant times Respondent was a distributor within the meaning of 40 CFR § 80.2(1).
- b. On May 1, 1995 EPA conducted an inspection at Gulf Oil's Linden terminal located at 2600 Marsh Dock Road, Linden, New Jersey. EPA's inspection determined that gasoline having a volatility greater than the allowable percentage was being sold or offered for sale at the time of the inspection. The gasoline's volatility was 8.71 psi, which violates the applicable standard of 8.3 psi in a VOC Control Region 2. This constitutes a violation of 40 C.F.R § 80.78(a)(1).



- c. EPA further determined that Respondent was a distributor of this gasoline, making Respondent liable for the violations pursuant to 40 CFR § 80.28.
- d. In order to prevent future violations, Respondent has implemented the following changes at all of Gulf's terminals:
  - (1) in advance of May 1 of each year, Gulf terminal operators must have a test result showing the gasoline meets VOC control standards without the application of any enforcement test tolerance;
  - (2) this test result will be based on analysis of top, middle and bottom spot samples, as well as a running sample, in order to ensure that there is no stratification in storage, sales and blending tanks;
  - (3) fuel sampling is done in conformity with Appendix D of 40 CFR Part 80.
- e. Jurisdiction to settle this matter exists pursuant to section 211 of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7545, 40 CFR Part 80, and other provisions of law.
- 6. After considering the gravity of the alleged violation, Respondent's history of compliance, the terms of this Agreement, and other facts presented by Respondent, EPA has determined to conditionally remit and mitigate the civil penalty to Twenty-Seven Thousand and Forty-Four Dollars (\$27,044.00). Respondent agrees to pay Twenty-Seven Thousand Forty-Four Dollars (\$27,044.00) within thirty days of receipt of a signed settlement agreement from EPA. In the event Respondent does not receive a copy of this Agreement within

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thirty (30) days following its execution by EPA, the due date shall be thirty (30) days following the date of Respondent's receipt of an executed copy. In accordance with the Debt Collection Act of 1982, if the debt is not paid within thirty (30) days following the due date, interest will accrue from the due date at the rate of eight percent (8%) per annum, through the date of actual payment. A late payment handling charge of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) will also be imposed if the amount due is not paid by the due date, with an additional charge of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each additional thirty (30) day period. Respondent agrees to pay this amount by cashier's check or certified check with the notation "AED/MSEB - 4636" payable to the "United States of America," and mailed to:

7. Time is of the essence to this Agreement. Upon failure to timely perform pursuant to paragraph 6 of this Agreement, or upon default of or failure to comply with any terms of this Agreement by Respondent, the parties agree that upon such default of failure to comply, EPA may commence an action to enforce this Agreement or to recover the civil penalty pursuant to § 205 of the Clean Air Act; or

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pursue any other remedies available to it. Respondent specifically agrees that in the event of such default or failure to comply, EPA may proceed in an action based on the original claim of violation of § 203 of the Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7522, and Respondent expressly waives its right to assert that such action is barred by 28 U.S.C. § 2462, other statutes of limitation, or other provisions limiting actions as a result of the passage of time.

- 8. This Agreement becomes effective upon the date accepted by EPA, at which time a copy will be returned to Respondent.
- 9. Respondent hereby represents that the individual or individuals executing this Agreement on behalf of Respondent are authorized to do so and that such execution intended and is sufficient to bind Respondent, its officers, agents, directors, owners, heirs, assigns, and successors.
- 10. Respondent waives its rights, if any, to a hearing, trial or any other proceeding relating to matters consented to in Paragraphs 5(a), (b), (c) and 6. However Respondent retains its right and defenses in the event that EPA brings a subsequent civil or criminal action against Respondent arising out of the facts or allegations of wrongdoing contained in this Agreement.
- 11. The terms of this Agreement are contractual and not a mere recital. If any provision or provisions of this Agreement are held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.



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- 12. The validity, enforceability and construction of all matters pertaining to this Agreement shall be determined in accordance with applicable federal law.
- 13. Upon completion of the terms of this Agreement, this matter shall be deemed terminated and resolved. Nothing herein shall limit the right of EPA to proceed against Respondent in the event of default or noncompliance with this Agreement; for violations of § 203 of the Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. § 7522, which are not the subject matter of this Agreement; or for other violations of law.
