**EPA Announces the Availability of the Administrative Record  
for the Circle Environmental #1 and #2 Removal Sites in  
Dawson, Terrell County, Georgia**

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announces the Administrative Record for the Circle Environmental #1 and #2 Removal Sites in Dawson, Terrell County, Georgia.

The Administrative Record file includes documents that form the basis for selection of the removal action. A removal action is a short-term cleanup intended to stabilize a site that poses an imminent and substantial threat to human health or the environment. Documents in the record may include, but are not limited to, preliminary assessment and inspection reports, test results, and the Action Memorandum. All interested parties are encouraged to review the documents.

EPA will accept comments regarding the Administrative Record during the public comment period which will begin May 7, 2008 and end on June 5, 2008. Comments should be addressed to James W. Webster, Federal On-Scene Coordinator, US EPA Region 4 - ERRB 11<sup>th</sup> Floor, 61 Forsyth Street, SW, Atlanta, Georgia 30303. At the end of the 30-day comment period, a written response to all pertinent comments will be prepared in a responsiveness summary and placed in the file.

The Circle Environmental #1 (CE #1) Site is located 170 5<sup>th</sup> Street in downtown Dawson, Terrell County, Georgia. The Site is an inactive waste management facility that cleaned oil and solvent tainted wipe rags. Approximately 300 plus drums of suspected wastes were stored within the warehouse.

The Circle Environmental #2 (CE #2) Site is located at 2222 Albany Highway (Highway 520) in unincorporated Terrell County, Georgia, and is 100 X 100 feet in size and is located on private property, about 2 miles south of CE#1. Approximately 300 plus drums of suspected waste was found stored at the Site.
