When did the discrimination occur?

Date: On or about October 15, 2007 when residents are permitted to openly burn leaves and other yard debris.

Describe the acts of discrimination providing the name(s) where possible of the individuals who discriminated (use space on page 3 if necessary):

The City of Belleville, Illinois and the County of St. Clair, State of Illinois permit non-stop open leaf burning by residents. There is no enforcement of days or hours of burning. There is a thick haze over the entire city and county. I have already been to the hospital for emergency treatment and also to my physician for follow up treatment in the past week. The smoke blows into my house, I cannot even breath in my own home. I am experiencing severe respiratory distress as a result of the leaf burning. I cannot attend public functions out doors, because of all the smoke. I cannot take the Metrolink, public transportation, because of all of the smoke from leaf burning. I can't even go out and buy groceries on the weekends and utilize the public roads because of all of the blowing smoke from leaf burning. It triggers a severe asthma attack. I am taking more and more medication, but I can't breathe because of all the smoke. It just hangs in the air.

CITY	ST. CLAIR COUNTY LEAF BURNING REGULATIONS 2007 OPEN BURNING ORDINANCE AND COLLECTION OR DROP-OFF ALTERNATIVES
Alorton 618-271-4586	Follow EPA guidelines Residents can burn yard waste Collection: Residents arrange with private hauler.
Belleville 618-233-6810	Leaf burning only: October 1 through December 15 and April 15 through May 15 (10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.) Fine: \$100 to \$500 per occurrence Collection: Yard waste in paper bags or cans is collected by the city trucks the second full week of January, February, and March. Starting April weekly collection by city trucks through December 15.
Brooklyn 618-271-8424	No burn policy Collection: City picks up trash, yard waste & etc.
Cahokia 618-337-9517	Burn yard waste only on premises. When atmospheric conditions dissipate contaminants. Daylight hours only, with a person over 18. Burning not allowed on village streets. Collection: Residents arrange with private hauler.
Caseyville 618-344-1233	Burn yard waste only from dawn to dusk. Collection: Residents contracts with private hauler.
Centreville 618-332-1057	Yard Waste may be burned only on the premises in which it is produced during daylight hours only. Collection: Residents contract with private hauler. Conducts a once a year cleanup in the city where all types of yard waste and other items are collected.
Collinsville 618-344-5252	Ban on leaf burning. (No Burn Policy) Collection: Residents must arrange with a private hauler. City Street Department will provide bins in the fall at the Public Works Building (850 S. Morrison) from 9:00 A.M. 3:00 P.M. on various dates. City residents can bring properly bagged lawn waste and drop it off at no charge. Proof of residency is required. The city provides a bimonthly pickup of limbs – residents much schedule pickup at 618-346-5214.
Dupo 618-286-3280	Burning allowed year-round, except Monday through Wednesday, in a container on private property. Collection: Village picks up leaves.
East Carondelet 618-286-4660	Burn yard waste only. Daylight hours only, with a person over 18. No trash, agricultural waste, etc. (2006 Information)
East St. Louis 618-482-6811	Ban on leaf burning. (No Burn Policy) Residents can contract with private hauler
Fairmont City 618-274-4504	Burning allowed only during daylight hours, landscape waste only. Properly bagged waste can be dropped off at the city garage.
Fairview Heights 618-489-2000	Ordinance restricts burning to Nov. 1 to April 30, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 9:00 A.M. – 4:00 P.M. No burning on roadways, curb and gutter or open drainage way in the city. Collection: Residents contract with licensed private haulers for trash and yard waste collection.
Fayetteville 618-677-3343	Residents are allowed to burn yard waste. Collection: Yard waste may be taken to the area by the Sewer Plant.
Freeburg 618-539-5545	Burn landscape waste on premises on which it is generated, no trash. Only when atmospheric conditions readily dissipate contaminants. Only if burning does not create visibility hazards. Only during daylight hours with a person over the age of 18. No burning of landscape waste shall be permitted on village streets. No burning if fire chief deems it unsafe. Collection: City collects leaves using the "Billy Goat," a dump truck with a leaf vacuum, from Oct. 31 st - Dec. 9 th . Additional dates will be added if necessary.
Lebanon 618-537-2193	Open burning of landscape waste only during the hours between sunrise and sunset of the same day, and attended by a person no less than 12 years of age. No burning on city street, alley, sidewalk or thoroughfare. Burning may occurs only on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays during Sept. 15 through Dec. 15 and March 15 through May 15. (Leaves Only) Collection: Private hauler picks up yard waste by contract with residents.

Lenzburg Lenzburg Cont. 618-475-3347	Only burn what grows from the ground. No trash. Must finish burning before dusk. Can take yard waste to the city burn pile on Lake Drive. Drop off any time.
Marissa 618-295-2351	Landscape waste burned only on premises in which it was produced. Only when atmospheric conditions readily dissipate contaminants. Only if burning does not create a visibility hazard on roadways, walkways, or railroad tracks. Only during daylight hours with a person over the age of 18. No burning on village streets. No burning the weekend before Thanksgiving. Collection: Residents arrange for pick up with a private hauler. Residents can take landscape waste to the village shed (701 East Lyons). Landscape waste will be used for composting.
Mascoutah 618-566-2964	Ban on leaf burning. Collection: Residents arrange for pick up with a private hauler. Limb pickup provided on the 1 st and 3 rd Thursday of each month, limited to 15-minutes worth of pickup. Yard waste drop-off available at the Sewage Treatment Plant on Wed., Sat., and Sun. during daylight hours, for residents with city utilities only.
Millstadt 618-476-1514	Leaf burning allowed between sunrise and sunset. Cannot be within 3ft. of property line or within 12 ft. of combustible material. Attended by a competent person. As long as atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires non-hazardous. Collection: Millstadt offers leaf-vac service from Oct. 1 to Nov. 30, Mondays and Tuesdays.
New Athens 618-475-2144	Burning during daylight hours only. No burning on public streets, sidewalks or alleys. Collection: The city provides a drop-off site for yard waste, see City Hall for key.
New Baden 618-588-3813	Ban on leaf burning. Collection: Residents can arrange pick-up through Allied Waste Management at resident's cost.
O'Fallon 618-624-4500	Ban on leaf burning. Collection: City provides yard waste pick-up once a week on trash pick up day.
St. Clair County Unincorporated 618-233-7769	Landscape waste is only allowed to be burned on the premises where it is generated so long as a local ordinance does not restrict open burning.
St. Libory 618-768-4216	N/A
Sauget 618-337-5267	No ordinance. Collection: The city picks up yard waste on Friday throughout the year.
Scott A.F.B. 618-256-2092	No burning allowed. Waste is collected by garbage trucks weekly. Yard waste is placed in a separate container.
Shiloh 618-632-1022	Allowed to burn yard waste only, from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday between March 15 to June 1 and from Oct. 1 to Dec. 15. Burning on public or utility easement is prohibited. Burning that creates an excessive amount of smoke is prohibited. Collection: Resident arranges with a private hauler.
Smithton 618-233-4180	Burning of leaves is allowed until dusk. No burning on Sunday. Collection: Resident arranges with a private hauler.
Summerfield 618-934-3311	N/A
Swansea 618-234-0044	Yard Waste burning limited to Wednesday and Saturday, 11am to 4pm between Oct. 1 to Nov. 30 and April 1 to June 15. Collection: Residents can pay city \$12.75 for a sheet of 5 stickers, each good for pick-up of one bag of yard waste.
Washington Park 618-874-2100	Ban on leaf burning. \$500 fine. Collection: Resident can arrange with a private hauler for pickup of yard waste or call (618) 874-4800 to arrange pickup by the city.

HARMFUL EFFECTS AND ALTERNATIVES TO LEAF BURNING



As the fall approaches, the leaves will begin to turn brown, orange, yellow, red, gold colors. Looking at the leaves is a beautiful sight; however, they will fall from the trees, creating a cleanup problem for residents of St. Clair County. Burning leaves create heavy concentrations of toxic pollutants that are harmful to children, the elderly, asthmatics, healthy adults.....**EVERYONE**. The effects of leaf burning include:

- Increased hospital admissions for respiratory illnesses.
- Increased costs for trips to the doctor and medications for sensitive people.
- Increased mortality.
- Decreased visibility from intense leaf burning which increases the potential for auto accidents and death.
- Costs related to out-of-control fires such as personal injuries, property damage and cost for fire department.
- Personal injury and increased potential for injury to children.
- Airborne particles can aggravate the symptoms of those with respiratory problems.
- Those with chronic problems such as allergies and asthma are affected.
- 85% of the particles from leaf smoke are inhaled deep in the lungs which can cause adverse physical or chemical effects.
- Serious forest and grass fires may result from out-of-control leaf fires.
- The smoke from burning leaves affects more than just the yard or neighborhood where the burning occurs.
- Those experiencing respiratory problems have decreased mobility and cannot enjoy the fall season.
- Damage to streets can occur from piles of burning leaves.

Leaves can be properly cleaned up in an environmentally friendly way. Alternatives to leaf burning are listed below:



MULCH using a mulching lawn mower or spread out and mow over with a regular lawn mower



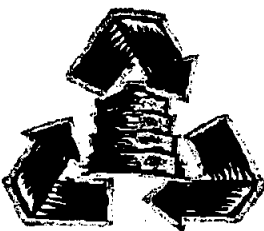
COMPOSTING reduces leaves in volume by 75%.



Put leaves out for **COLLECTION**. Call your city or trash hauler.



Give leaves to a farmer or gardener to fertilize their soil.



Take yard waste to a local landscape waste disposal site.
