The damage has been done to this community and the North Baton Rouge Sewage Treatment Plant continues to violate the people of this community. The sewage treatment plant is a major concern /problem / nuisance for this community which we suffer through on a daily basis. The strong offensive odors of human waste and other strong sickening chemical odors, causes the citizens (Adults and Children) of this community to become nauseated (ill) often. The disease carrying sewer flies / filter flies lands on the human waste through out the plant site during the daily process of the sewer plant, then the sewer flies soar and land through out the community spreading the contamination. The sewer flies have flown into the mouths of citizens while talking or trying to enjoy a meal at home, yes! in your food (inside and outside of our homes). There is community outcry! This was all done to this community, because this is a minority and poor community.
