

Attached hereto as Exhibit B is a copy of the Initial Solid Waste Facility License issued by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency on October 25, 2005. This license was issued less than 180 days ago from the date that this complaint is being filed.

The second instance of discrimination is the renewal of this license, which occurred just two months after the initial issuance of the above license. Attached hereto as Exhibit C is a copy of the license issued on December 23, 2005. Again, this is less than 180 days from the date of the filing of this Complaint.

Waste Management of Ohio, Inc. ("WMO") has built a new waste transfer facility in the Winton Hills community, an area predominantly occupied by minorities and low income individuals. The waste transfer station was put into this area with the expectation that these low income and minority people would have little or no hope of being able to defend their constitutionally-protected civil rights. WMO received its first license to operate on October 25, 2005, from Ohio EPA. Almost immediately after receiving its initial license to operate from Ohio EPA, WMO received its renewal of the license on December 23, 2005.

Environmental justice concerns were studied for this location relative to the placement of a Waste Transfer Station in the Winton Hills Community, but are being specifically ignored by Ohio EPA, and are being specifically ignored by the City of Cincinnati Health Department, which holds the licensing hearings on behalf of, as agent for, and under contract with, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. Accordingly, both Ohio EPA, and the City of Cincinnati Health Department are violating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

The issuance of the permits to operate by Ohio EPA constitutes a violation of the civil rights of the citizens of the Winton Hills community, as guaranteed by the United States Constitution. Communities United for Action ("CUFA"), on behalf of the Winton Hills Community, has fought to stop the installation of this facility in the poor minority neighborhood, and has fought to prevent the operation of the facility in this neighborhood. To date, although licensed, the facility has not operated as a solid waste transfer facility.

The City of Cincinnati has considered environmental justice issues to be important in the selection of a waste transfer facility. Despite the City of Cincinnati's efforts, WMO has convinced Ohio EPA and the City of Cincinnati Health Department that it is not necessary to consider environmental justice issues when locating or licensing a waste transfer station.

Exhibit D is a report dated 4/23/97 from the City of Cincinnati recommending that environmental justice issues should be a priority for the city. Specifically, Page 4 of the document includes a recommendation from the City Manager for the adoption of an Environmental Justice program. Exhibit E is a report dated 5/15/01 in which the City of Cincinnati included consideration of environmental justice issues into its site selection process for a solid waste transfer station. Attention is specifically drawn to Page 8 of this document, in which the Winton Hills community was **specifically excluded** as a potential site for a solid waste transfer station, due to environmental justice concerns. Exhibit F is a resolution dated 2/21/02 from the City of Cincinnati City Council urging the City of Cincinnati Board of Health to deny WMO a license to operate a solid waste facility in Winton Hills due to "serious concerns as to whether Waste Management can operate its facilities in full compliance with environmental regulations".

As noted in Exhibits D through F, the City of Cincinnati is crying out for Environmental Justice in its communities. Having operated a landfill in the Winton Hills neighborhood for over twenty years, WMO knew that it was operating in a low income African-American community. Despite knowing that the Winton Hills community was a low income African-American community, and despite knowing that the City of Cincinnati had concluded that Winton Hills was not a desirable location for a waste transfer station due to environmental justice concerns, WMO plunged forward with a callous disregard for the civil rights of minorities and underprivileged persons in the community. Nevertheless, neither Ohio EPA nor its authorized agent, the City of Cincinnati Health Department, have considered Environmental Justice in the siting or the licensing of the WMO transfer station. The citizens of Winton Hills community have suffered a vital blow to their plans for obtaining a more livable community in the future.

That any permit issued by OEPA to Waste Management of Ohio to install a waste transfer facility in the Winton Hills community be rescinded and that the solid waste transfer station never be allowed to operate in this predominately minority and low income area. Also, any and all other relief to which the Winton Hills community is entitled pursuant to this proceeding, including but not limited to, actual damages, injunctive relief, legal fees and expenses.




