Restoration Listening Sessions

Ocean Conservancy, in association with the Environmental Protection Agency, a member of the Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council, invites you to attend an upcoming series of Listening Sessions to discuss Gulf restoration priorities and opportunities provided by a portion of the RESTORE Act.

Approximately \$150-\$180 million is currently available to restore the Gulf from the BP Deepwater Horizon oil disaster. Guided by a Comprehensive Plan, Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council members have proposed 50 restoration projects and programs to be considered on a Draft Funded Priorities List. These sessions will provide an opportunity to learn about proposed projects and will include a forum to discuss shared priorities and opportunities for restoration. Come ready to learn, ask questions, discuss community priorities and leave knowing that your voice matters!
