RE: Exceptional event requests regarding exceedances of the PM<sub>2.5</sub> NAAQS in Shasta County, CA and Plumas County, CA


Dear Ms. Nichols:

This letter responds to ARB's submittal regarding PM<sub>2.5</sub> National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) exceedances at the Quincy, Plumas County monitor on June 26, July 8, and July 11, 2008, and the Redding, Shasta County monitor on June 29, July 5, and July 17, 2008. ARB has requested that EPA exclude these exceedances from consideration when making decisions related to Shasta County's and Plumas County's attainment status.

Our response to ARB's request is governed by the "Treatment of Data Influenced by Exceptional Events" rule (72 FR 13560, March 22, 2007). After careful consideration of the information provided, we are concurring with ARB's request to flag these exceedances as exceptional events. The basis for our decision is set forth in the enclosed document.
