

OUR STORY


Our work grew out of the National Urban Waters Federal Partnership, which works with urban communities, particularly those that are underserved or economically distressed, to connect with and restore their urban water resources.

We're now growing into a locally-driven regional association that fosters a culture shift for regional collaboration in our watershed.

Specifically, the South Platte Urban Waters Partnership focuses on the headwaters and Denver metropolitan area of the South Platte River Watershed.

OUR MISSION

The South Platte River Urban Waters Partnership collaborates across jurisdictions and disciplines to engage communities, and to protect and restore the South Platte River and Watershed. We are members of non-governmental organizations (NGOs), businesses, universities, local and state government, as well as federal agencies, all leveraging our collective resources to reach common goals.



OUR FOCUS

The South Platte Urban Waters Partnership focuses on three key areas that work together to affect lasting change.

WATER AWARENESS

Engaging communities in discovering the value of their urban water resources.

WATER PROTECTION

Protecting critical watershed areas that affect the water supply for Denver metro communities.

WATER QUALITY

Partnership efforts within the community lead to improved health of the watershed and improved water quality.

OUR APPROACH

Our interdisciplinary partnership focuses on our common desired outcomes while advancing our individual missions. The result? A holistic approach that not only benefits local water resources, but also improves and strengthens the community as a whole.

We focus on the following strategies:

- Advance an interconnected network of ecological and green infrastructure for healthier waterways and for social and economic gains to adjacent communities
- Align efforts of utility providers and government, academic, private and non-profit entities
- Support high impact projects by leveraging funds
- Provide regional platform for coordinated water quality efforts
- Protect forests that provide drinking water supply
- Link healthy lifestyles to the urban water corridor
- Promote cross-boundary educational campaigns to raise awareness of the importance of our local waterways
