This letter responds to the Chamber of Commerce's Request for Correction ("RFC")¹, submitted on December 19, 2011, pursuant to the *Guidelines for Ensuring and Maximizing the Quality, Objectivity, Utility, and Integrity of Information Disseminated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)*². In your RFC, you request correction of information found in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's background technical support document titled "Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reporting from the Petroleum and Natural Gas Industry."³

As noted in your RFC, the information quality concerns raised in this request are similar to other public comments sent to the EPA for the rulemaking entitled *Oil and Natural Gas Sector: New Source Performance Standards and National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants Reviews*⁴. The EPA placed your RFC in the docket (Docket ID No. EPA-HQ-OAR-2010-0505) for this rulemaking.

The Administrator issued the final rule in April 2012. The Agency's response to the information quality concerns raised in the public comments received during the comment period can be found either in the preamble to the final rule or on pages 18-20 and 61-62 of the accompanying Response to Comments document.
