
Population Surrounding 3,772 RCRA Corrective Action Sites

RCRA Corrective Action (CA) sites exist in thousands of communities across the U.S. ranging from remote to large urban settings. Many of these sites are in economically distressed communities. To help describe who benefits from EPA's RCRA CA Program cleanup work, the Agency used 2015-2018 American Community Survey populations data and FY 2019 RCRA CA to summarize the population living within 3 and 1 miles of RCRA CA sites.

Population within 1 Mile of Sites:

Approximately 29 million people live within 1 mile of a RCRA CA site (roughly 9% of the U.S. population) including approximately:

- 9% of all children in the U.S. under the age of 5
- 9% of all children in the U.S. under 18
- 11% of all blacks in the U.S.
- 11% of all Hispanics in the U.S.
- 11% of all minorities in the U.S.
- 11% of all households in the U.S. below the poverty level
- 10% of all people with less than a high school education in the U.S.
- 12% of the linguistically isolated people in the U.S.



Population within 3 Miles of Sites:

Approximately 113 million people live within 3 miles of a RCRA CA site (roughly 35% of the U.S. population) including approximately:

- 36% of all children in the U.S. under the age of 5
- 34% of all children in the U.S. under 18
- 44% of all blacks in the U.S.
- 42% of all Hispanics in the U.S.
- 43% of all minorities in the U.S.
- 40% of all households in the U.S. below the poverty level
- 38% of all people with less than a high school education in the U.S.
- 46% of the linguistically isolated people in the U.S.

Demographics of Near-Site Populations:

While there is no single way to characterize communities located near our sites, this population is *more minority, low income, linguistically isolated, and less likely to have a high school education* than the U.S. population as a whole.

Methodology:

A circular site boundary, equal to the site acreage, was modeled around the latitude/longitude for each site and then a **3- or 1- mile** buffer ring was placed around the site boundary. American Community Survey (ACS) 2015-2018 census data was then identified for each block group with a centroid that fell within the **3- or 1- mile** area.

Data used includes: (1) RCRA CA site information as of the end of FY2019; and (2) ACS 2015-2018 census data. Site data from FY2019 included 3,722 RCRA CA sites in the 50 U.S. states and Puerto Rico with accurate locational data.

IMPORTANT Caveats:

- Data collected represent a <u>national look</u> at the characteristics of the population in communities surrounding our sites. While some of the data point to possible Environmental Justice (EJ) characteristics of the population, this is not an EJ analysis.
- Proximity to a site does not necessarily represent risk of adverse health effects. The risk of exposure to contamination <u>varies significantly</u> across all sites.
- Data are a snapshot in time only, the site and population information will change over time (can be updated every year when new census data comes out and compared over time in 5-year intervals).
- Used best available information, but data collected are estimates only, for the following reasons:
 - Used a single latitude/longitude location to model site boundaries based on acreage, not the actual site boundaries.
 - Used centroid points of the census block groups which under-estimates the population in some cases, and over-estimates in others.
