The LGAC stands ready to assist and support EPA in its efforts to distribute the training module to communities in urban and rural areas all across the nation.

The LGAC commends EPA's efforts to help local communities anticipate and prepare for a changing climate. We are committed to supporting EPA by distributing and publicizing this important training to local officials across the country. For example, we plan to utilize existing national, state, and local associations, such as the US Conference of Mayors, National Governors Association, National Association of Counties, and others, to encourage local officials to take the training themselves and distribute it more widely in their communities.

As a follow-on activity, the LGAC recommends that EPA create a neighborhood training module.
