- 1. **Prerequisites.** Students must be:
 - U.S. Citizens;
 - 18 years of age on or before the first day of the internship; and,
 - Enrolled at least half-time in an undergraduate (e.g., six credits per semester for undergraduates) or graduate program at a college, community college, or university.
- 2. **Time Commitment**: We accept full or part time interns and you should expect to work Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. Some exceptions can be made if you have class or program requirements.
- 3. **Compensation:** The internships are **unpaid**; however you may be eligible for a transit subsidy.
- 4. Students should have work experience or course work in the following:
 - Writing and presentation;
 - Research, including web research;
 - Intermediate proficiency in Microsoft applications such as Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Access:
 - Interest in environmental issues, education, government, or public service; and,
 - Team participation, collaboration and outreach.
