

Laureen Laglagaron is an Attorney Advisor at the Federal Coordination and Compliance Section of the Civil Rights Division, U.S. Department of Justice. She handles discrimination cases; provides technical and legal assistance; offers regulatory, policy and program review; and coordinates federal civil rights enforcement with respect to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Executive Order 13166, *Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency*. Her work focuses on national origin discrimination against persons with limited English proficiency. In addition to managing and conducting administrative investigations of recipients of federal financial assistance, Ms. Laglagaron manages the Attorney General's initiative recommitting the Department to language access obligations under Executive Order 13166.

Prior to joining the Department of Justice, Ms. Laglagaron was a Policy Analyst at the Migration Policy Institute (API) specializing in U.S. immigration and immigrant integration policy. At MPI, she directed and managed MPI's language access program and performed independent research and policy analysis for the National Center on Immigrant Integration Policy. Her research and publications focused on language access, legalization implementation, citizenship, state and local governance, and binational immigrant integration.

Ms. Laglagaron practiced immigration and family law in San Francisco, CA as an Equal Justice Works Fellow at Asian Pacific Islander (API) Legal Outreach. At API Legal Outreach, Ms. Laglagaron implemented a self-designed project aimed at providing culturally and linguistically sensitive legal services and community legal education to low-income Filipino American immigrants in the Greater Bay Area. She represented individual clients in affirmative applications for immigration relief, deportation defense and related family law matters.

Ms. Laglagaron received her JD from the University of California, Los Angeles, School of Law where she received a certificate from the Program in Public Interest Law and Policy. Ms. Laglagaron holds a BA in Economics and Sociology/Anthropology from Swarthmore College.
