**EPA's Objection to the Draft Water Discharge Permit for
Dayton Power & Light J.M. Stuart Station**
Hearing: March 23, 2011
Comment Period: Feb. 17 – April 7, 2011

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is holding a public hearing and comment period to obtain comments on its objection to the thermal limitations in a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit under the Clean Water Act developed by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (NPDES Discharge Permit #OH0004316).

The draft permit is for the Dayton Power & Light J. M. Stuart Station, a coal fired power plant, to discharge into Little Three Mile Creek, the Ohio River and Buzzard's Roost Creek. The facility is located on State Route 52, 4 miles east of Aberdeen, Ohio. Ohio EPA issued a public notice of the draft permit on Nov. 7, 2008. Written and oral comments will be accepted at the **public hearing**:

For those wishing to make an oral comment, EPA will begin sign in at 6:30 p.m. and start the formal hearing at 7:30 p.m. EPA will give a brief presentation and then accept oral comments and written comments. Oral comments will generally be heard in the order in which the commenters signed in. The hearing will be held under rules listed in 40 Code of Federal Regulations § 123.44(e) (see www.epa.gov/lawsregs/index.html to read 40 CFR).
