**DATE OF THIS NOTICE: March 16, 2016**

**PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE:** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that no further action is necessary at this facility under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), as amended, for the CEMEX (Facility) (EPA ID PAD083965897).

**FACILITY DESCRIPTION:** The facility is located at 2001 Portland Park, Wampum, Pennsylvania 16157, and consists of 70 acres.

**COMMENT PROCESS:** Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period beginning March 16, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Mr. Grant Dufficy, as listed above, and must be received prior to April 18, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

**FINAL DECISION:** EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
