

# HOW TO EMBED YOUTUBE VIDEOS IN A NEWS RELEASE

# Why videos?

- Videos are very effective at telling a story, and for sharing.
- EPA videos are generally posted in YouTube. Most are brief, 30 seconds to 3 minutes.
- EPA videos can feature anyone or anything. Most often it's the Administrator or other senior-level official.
- Usually only high-visibility news releases include a specially prepared video, often due to time required to meet video technical and legal requirements, and expense.
- Such videos often include the Administrator speaking on the topic (of the news release).

# This training assumes..

- you know how to create a basic news release using the EPA Web CMS.
- the EPA video is already posted in YouTube and is publically available.

# This training covers..

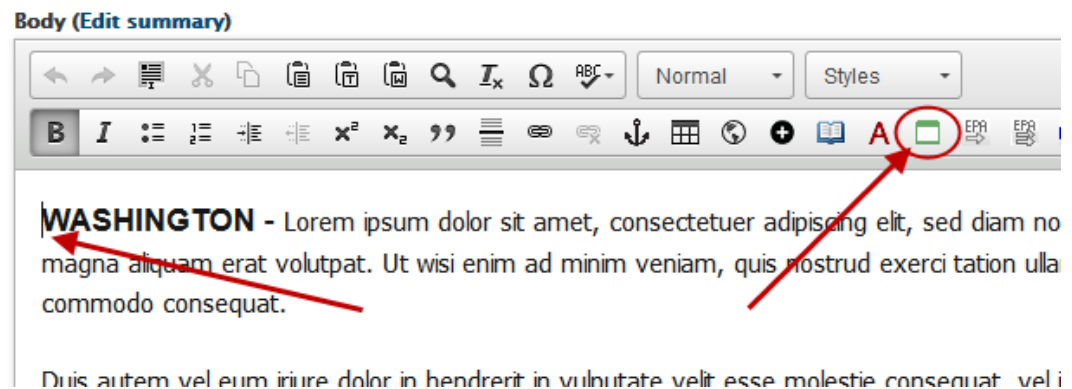
- What you need to have ready ahead of time.
- How to **embed** a YouTube video in a news release.
  - “Embed” mean adding the video in the news release so it’s playable right in the news release page
  - Also, this will help you meet EPA and federal requirements for YouTube videos.
- How to add a link in the news release, so people who receive the news release by email can get to the EPA page with the video.
- Whom to call if you need help.

# You will need...

- The YouTube video's public URL, or URLs if there is more than one.
- HINT: One way to have the URL(s) handy is to open the YouTube videos in a new browser window.
- NOTE - you may need to STOP each video or else it may play through and a related video will begin.

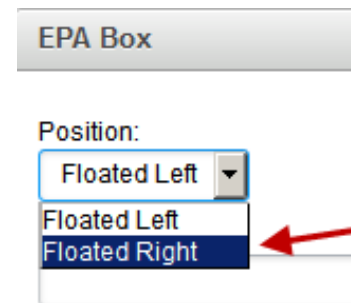
# First, insert a text box into your news release.

- First prep the news release body text as usual.
- Then put the cursor at the start of the first line of the news release. This will let you place the box with the photos at top right.
- Click the little “text box” icon.



# Adjust the text box.

- Change the Position” to Floated Right.

- Type “Videos” in the box title.
- Click “Save.”

# Start the box content.

- You should now see the “Videos” text box on the top right of your news release.
- *Pause here.*

Enter your box content here.

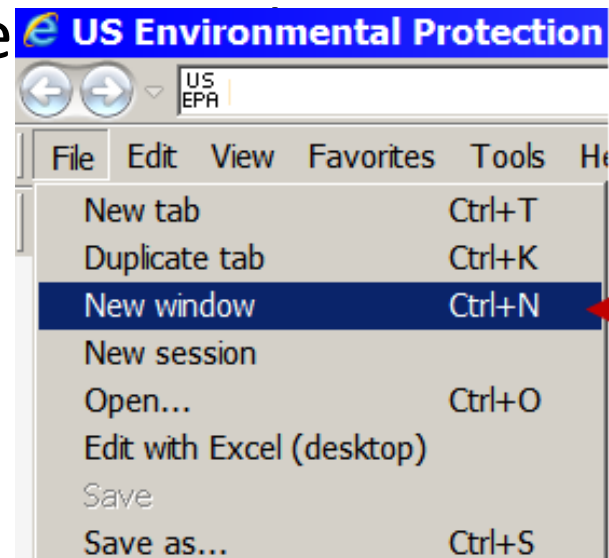


# Adding the Video

- There are several easy steps. You will need to make a simple, specific edit to one line of HTML code.
- The following instructions will show you exactly how to do this.
- Unlike photos or actualities, there is no “upload” step to embed a Youtube video.

# Open a new browser window or tab

- Hit Control-N for a new window or Control-T for a tab.
- The reason for doing this is to not lose your place while adding the news rele



# Go to the video on YouTube in the new browser window.

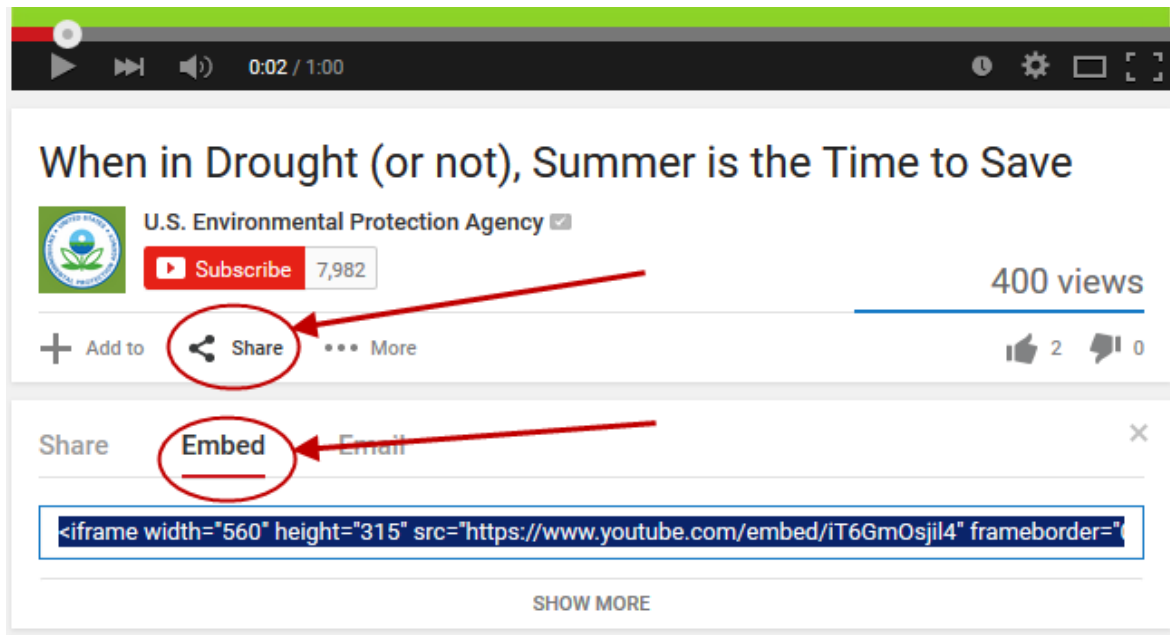

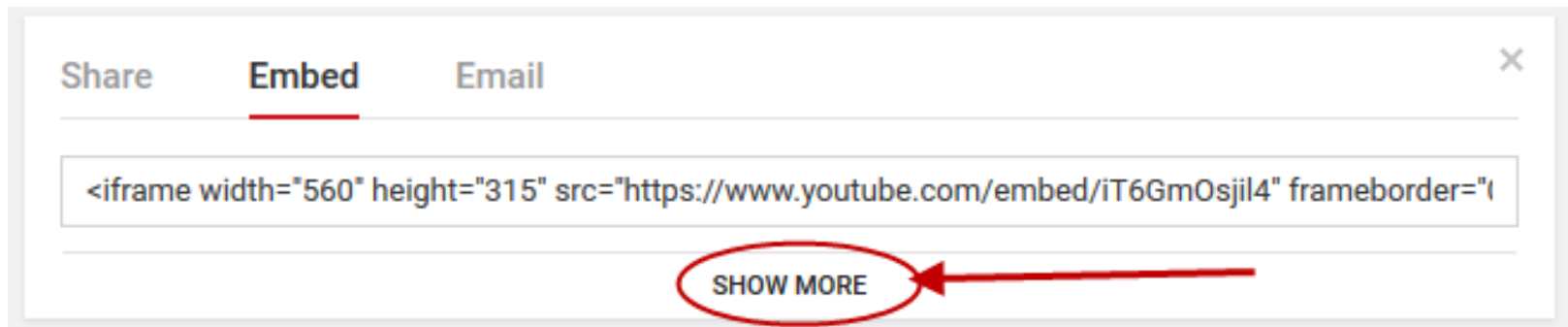
# Open the video's embed info

- Under the video's name, click the **Share** button.
- Then click the **Embed** button.



# Find the embed HTML code.

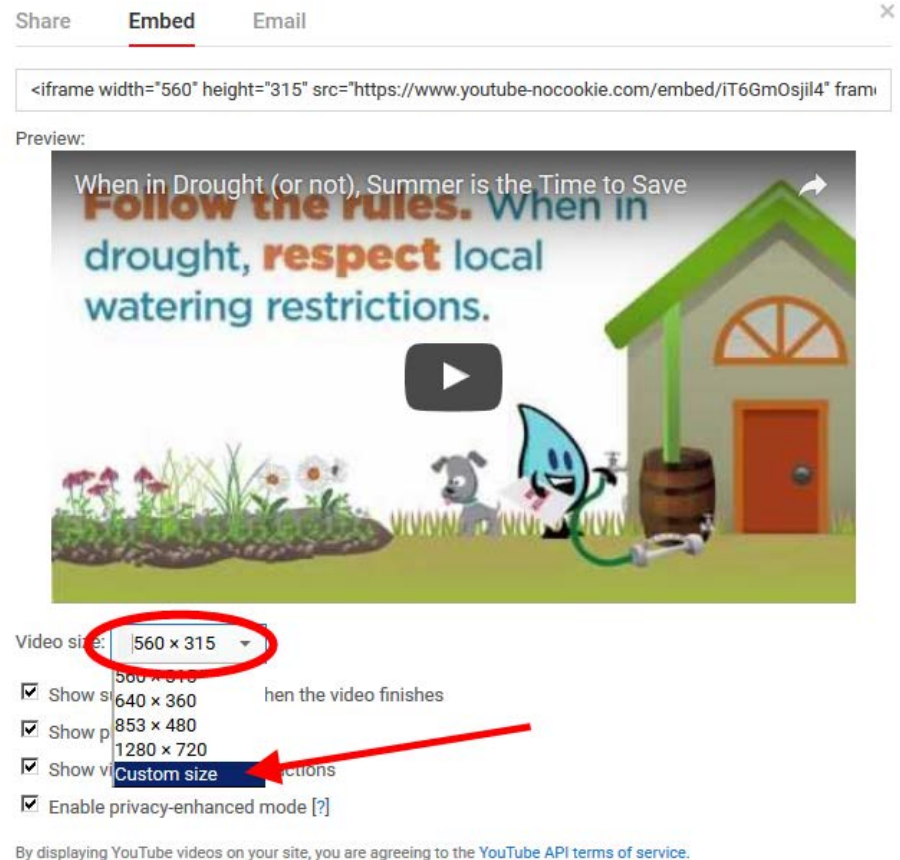
- Click the “SHOW MORE” under the line of embed code.



# DO TWO THINGS:

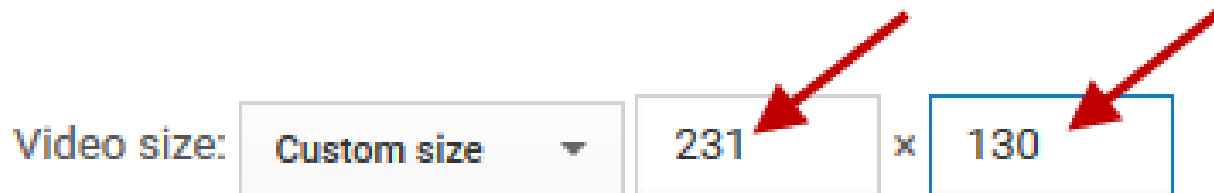
## Change the “Custom size” of the embed

- When you click SHOW MORE, the embed info will expand.
- Click the Video Size pull-down and change it to “Custom Size.”



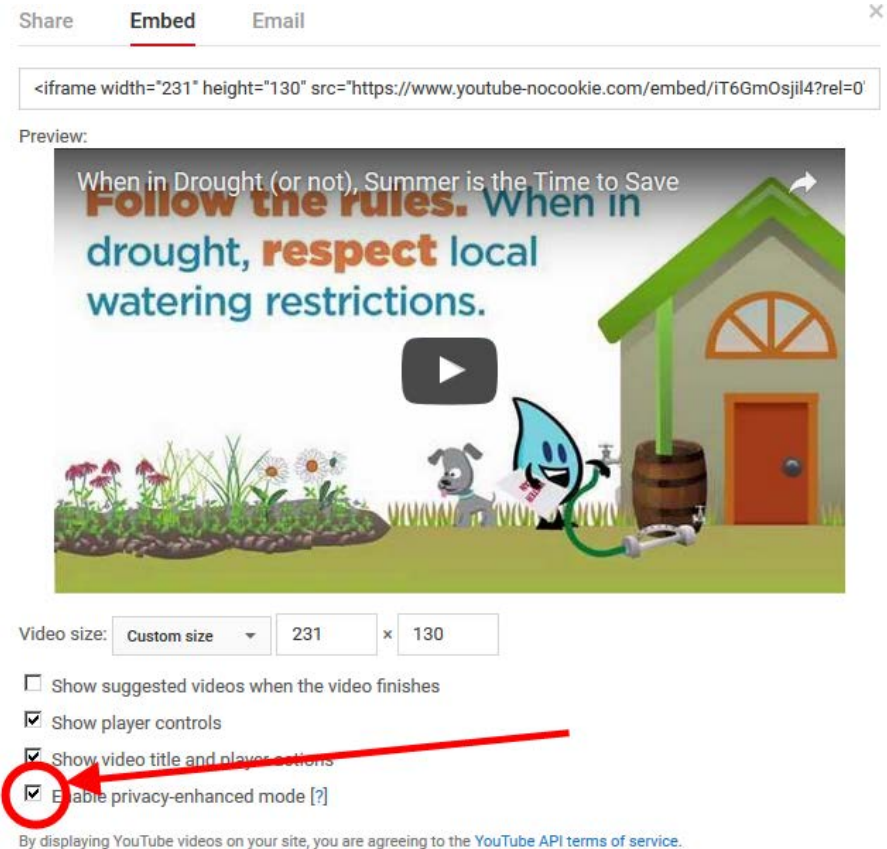
# Set the custom size to 231 by 130

- **Recommended: type 231 and 130**, respectively into the two custom size boxes.
- The numbers are width and height in pixels. This size works well in news releases.



# DO TWO THINGS: and Check the privacy box

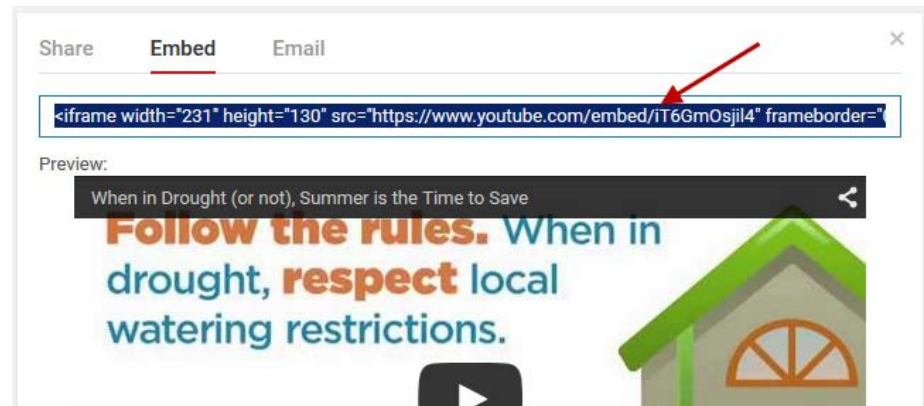
- This ensures that Google/YouTube is not adding cookies to our users' computers without their consent.



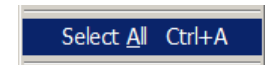


# Copy the Embed HTML code

- Copy the entire embed HTML code from the top of the embed box.
- Be sure to copy ALL the embed code.\*

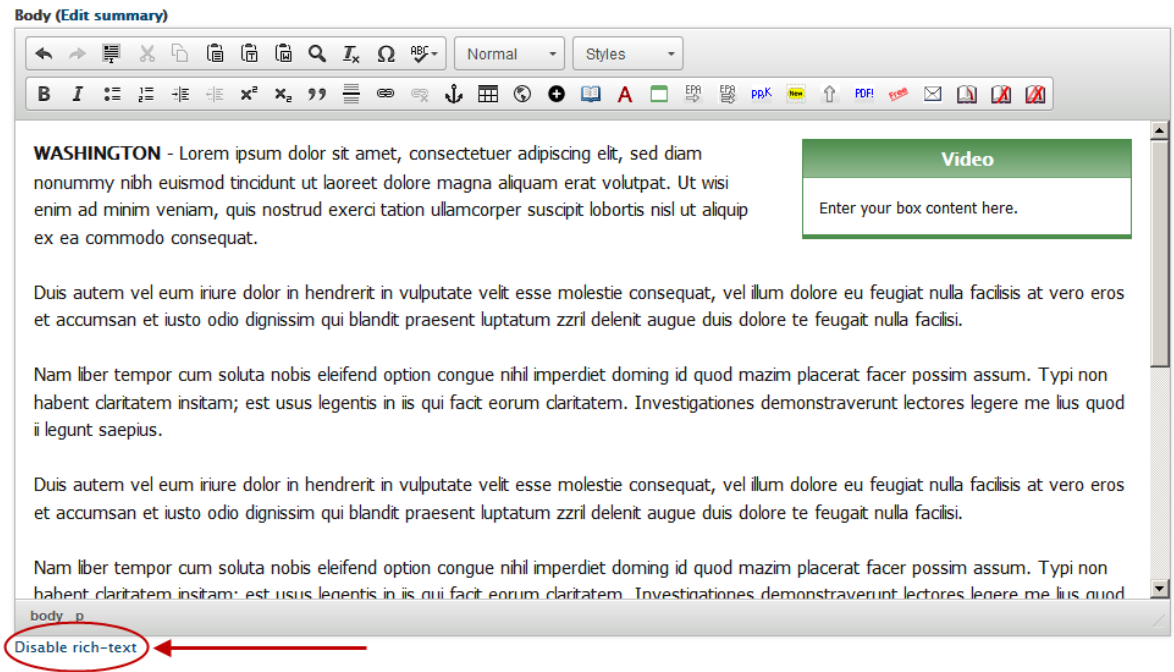


\*HINT: Drag your cursor across the all the code from left to right, or click once in the code and use "Select All" in your browser Edit menu.



# Go to the browser window with the draft news release you were editing

- At bottom left of the news release body text box, click “Disable rich-text.”
- This will change to the *HTML code of the news release*.




# Update the text box HTML code

- Find the HTML code of the video text box.
- It will be several lines of code and should be at top left (even though the final text box will position on the right).

# Replace the “Enter your content” sentence

- Carefully, select the entire line of **<p>Enter your box content here.</p>**

# Replace the “Enter your content” sentence

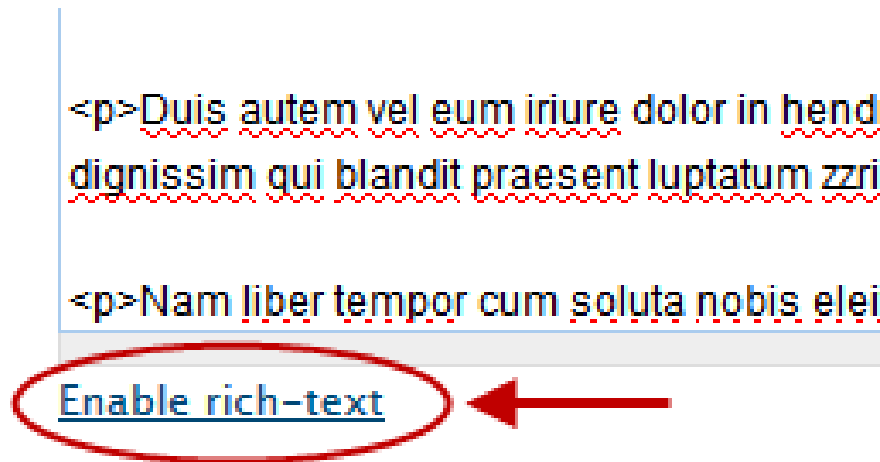
- **Paste.** The embed code from your YouTube video should still be on your paste clipboard.
- You should now see a long line of code inserted into the text box code. It may look very messy – that’s OK!

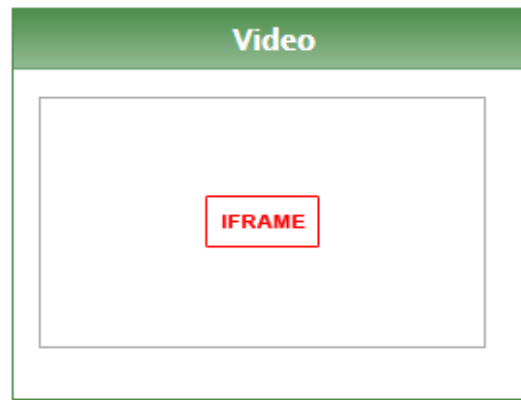
# Go back to the regular view.

- At bottom left under the text box, click “Enable rich-text.” This will take you back to the *regular text-editing view*.



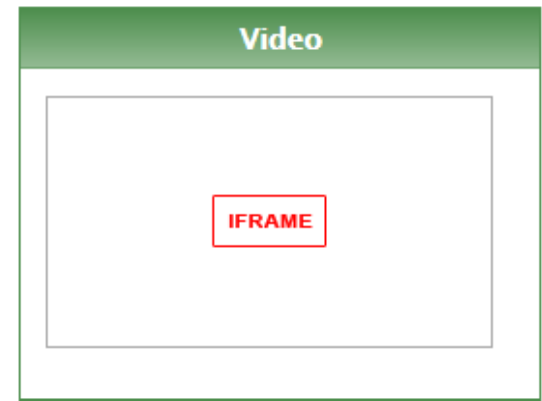
# In the regular edit view.

- You should now see an “iframe” placeholder icon in the Video text box.
- The video isn’t playable until you save the draft news release.



# Done Adding.

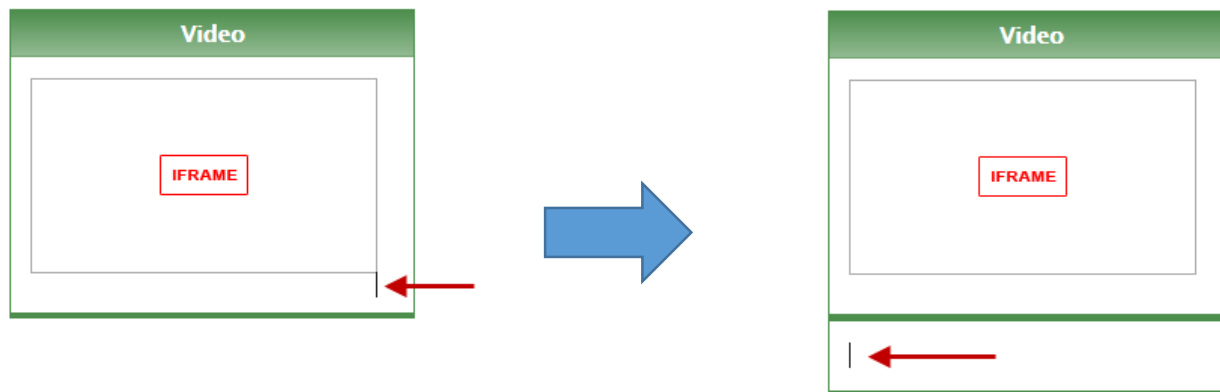
- Your draft news release should now show the “Videos” box at top right, with the video **placeholder icon**.
- The video **will not show** here (you’re still in edit mode, remember).
- Another video? *See next slide.*





# To Add Another Video

- Position the cursor to the bottom right of the previous video
- Press <Return> to move the cursor down and insert a space.
- Follow the same steps as adding the previous video.



# To Test It.

- To see how they really look, you must **SAVE** the draft news release.
- When you save the draft, the video placeholder icon will automatically change to the video and it will be playable.



# Note about publishing.

- There is no separate “publish” step for the embedded video. The embedded video will just publish along with the news release page.

***Keep going...*** There's one more important step.

# IMPORTANT STEP – LINK TO THE PAGE

- Remember, EPA news releases are emailed to readers in Vocus, as well as posted as a web page.
- IMPORTANT - an email of the news release doesn't include the embedded videos (or links to them).
- The Vocus email of the news release **needs to include a link to the web page news release.**

# STEPS FOR YOUR NEWS RELEASE

## **IN THE WEB CMS:**

- In the news release, add simple link text, such as, “Videos from the event.”
- Publish your news release live on the EPA Web site.
- Copy its public URL, e.g.,  
<http://www.epa.gov/newsreleases/whatever>
- Unpublish the news release, and open it for editing.
- Hotlink the sentence above to the URL.
- Republish the news release (when ready to publish).

## **IN VOCUS:**

- Add the hotlink above to your news release that you send in Vocus.
