DATE OF THIS NOTICE: April 22, 2016

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that Corrective Action Complete without Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Safety Kleen Inc., Glen Burnie facility (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 150-G Penrod Court, Glen Burnie, MD. The Facility collected, stored, and transferred hazardous wastes and wastewaters. The Facility was permitted for the Storage and Treatment of a wide variety of listed wastes.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending May 23, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, as listed above, and must be received prior to May 23, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
