DATE OF THIS NOTICE: June 22, 2016

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that Corrective Action is Complete and requiring land use restrictions under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Andritz, Inc., Muncy, PA facility (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 35 Sherman Street, Muncy, PA. The Facility originally included 42 acres, however, approximately 10 acres have been sold. The Facility has operated since 1866 in the fabrication of steel casings and sheet metal.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending July 22, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Maureen Essenthier, as listed above, and must be received prior to July 22, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
