DATE OF THIS NOTICE: June 1, 2016

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that Corrective Action is Complete requiring land use restrictions under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the former National Can Corp. Morrisville, PA facility (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 1001 Newford Mill Road, Fairless Hills, Pennsylvania. The Facility covers approximately 14 acres. The Facility operated between 1967 until 1989 and tinned steel for producing cans. The Facility is currently vacant and is occupied by a 172,732 square foot warehouse, 4,916 square feet of office space and 112 paved parking spaces.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending July 1, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Leonard Hotham, as listed above, and must be received prior to July 1, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
