Public Notice

DATE OF THIS NOTICE: August 31, 2016

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that no further action is necessary under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Avery Dennison facility (Facility). The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection previously approved a clean-up on June 21, 2016.

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 317 South Thomas Avenue, Sayre, PA 18840. Avery Dennison (EPA ID # PAD 080879588) is approximately 2 ½ acres in size and consists of one building, which is approximately one acre in size. The site is approximately 1,000 feet west of the Susquehanna River. Avery Dennison is the current owner of the site and manufactured machinery for printing clothing labels. Prior to 1920, the Sayre Brewing Company owned the property. From approximately 1920 until 1950, the property was owned and operated by the Sayre Candy Company. Avery Dennison, formerly Packaging Systems Corporation – Fasco Division, has owned the facility since 1952.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending September 30, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Grant Dufficy, as listed above, and must be received prior to September 30, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
