PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision of Corrective Action Complete without Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for Omnova Solutions, Inc.

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: Omnova Solutions, Inc. (Omnova) is located at 1001Chambers Avenue, Jeannette, PA 15644 (Facility). The Facility was previously owned and operated by the Pennsylvania Rubber Company in 1901 and the General Tire and Rubber Company in 1945. Omnova purchased the Facility in 1991 and is the current owner and operator. Omnova currently manufactures polyvinyl chloride (PVC) film/sheeting for various applications.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending September 26, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Kevin Bilash, as listed above, and must be received prior to September 26, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
