Public Notice

DATE OF THIS NOTICE: [August 30, 2016]

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision to approve a Risk-Based Self-Implementing PCB Cleanup Plan (40 C.F.R. 761.61(c)) at the Poor Charlie and Company, Inc., Riverside facility (Facility) in Glasgow, WV under the Toxic Substances Control Act.

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 7090 East DuPont Avenue, Glasgow, West Virginia. The facility operated as a salvage yard for several decades. PCB contamination from salvaging operations has impacted onsite soils and trammel material on the 17 acre property. PCB impacted soils and trammel material with PCB concentrations less than 500 PPM will be consolidated and disposed of onsite in an engineered waste management unit. All PCB remediation waste with concentrations above 500 PPM will be removed, transported, and disposed at an approved TSCA regulated disposal facility.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending September 2, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Scott Rice, as listed above, and must be received prior to September 2, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable TSCA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
