A. Background:

On November 10, 2008, EPA issued the Final Decision to select institutional Controls as the Final Remedy at the Facility. For institutional Controls, the Final Remedy requires an environmental covenant to be entered pursuant to the Pennsylvania Uniform Environmental Covenant Act and to be recorded with the deed for the Facility property.

The covenant was executed on June 25, 2008 and recorded with the Blair County on July 16, 2008. Pursuant to the covenant, the property is subject to the following activity and use limitations:

- The groundwater at and under the Property shall not be used for any drinking or agricultural purpose unless written approval for such use is received from PADEP or its successor.
- 2. The property shall be used solely for non-residential purposes. The covenant also includes a Compliance Reporting provision that states: "By the end of every third January following the effective date of this Environmental Covenant, the Owner and each subsequent owner shall submit, to the Department and any Holder listed in paragraph 3, written documentation stating whether or not the activity and use limitations in this Covenant are being abide by."

The site has been redeveloped. The property owner has been reporting the owner's compliance with the environmental covenant by the end of every third January following the effective date of the Covenant. Monitoring wells were abandoned in 2008.
