PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision of Corrective Action Complete with Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Allegheny Ludlum Corp. facility (Facility) located at 242 Allvac Lane, Latrobe, Pennsylvania.

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility was formerly known as the Teledyne Vasco Company until the late 1990's when Allegheny Ludlum purchased the property. The Facility manufactures specialty steels. Finished manufactured products consist of molded ingots and pressed bars.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30 day comment period ending December 28, 2016. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Khai M. Dao, as listed above, and must be received prior to December 28, 2016. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
