DATE OF THIS NOTICE: March 17, 2017

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision of Corrective Action Complete with Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the AdvanSix Resins & Chemicals LLC facility, Chester, VA (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The Facility is located at 4101 Bermuda Hundred Road, Chester, Virginia. The Facility, formerly known as the Honeywell Chesterfield Resins and Chemicals LLC, is an active nylon resins manufacturing plant.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30-day comment period ending April 16, 2017. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Russell Fish, as listed above, and must be received prior to April 16, 2017. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
