Identification

- Oval bodied, flattened, wingless, six legs
- · Color: adults brown to red nymphs - nearly colorless
- · Eggs: white, glued to rough surfaces

Signs

- Small black droppings, blood stains or shed skins on bottom bed sheet.
- · Red, itchy rashes from bites.

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
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
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
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
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
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Actual Size

Early detection and prompt responsé can avoid larger problems

Where to Look

- · Behind headboards
- Along mattress seams and in box springs
- Along baseboards
- In and under furniture

Additional Facts

- · Can survive months without feeding
- · Not known to transmit human disease
- Active and feed mostly at night
- Can be spread via used furniture, especially mattresses.
- Reactions to bites vary widely

I Have Bed Bugs, Now What?

- Capture it in a clear zip bag or with clear tape for identification
- · Educate your family on controls
- Do not panic and throw out furniture
- Install mattress encasements and bed bug interceptors
- Consult a pest management professional
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
