Abstract:

RideFinders, a division of GRTC Transit System, is the transportation demand management (TDM) program that serves the Richmond Region currently supported financially mainly through Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ) funding provided by the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO), the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (VDRPT), the City of Richmond, Chesterfield County, Henrico County, and the Crater Planning District Commission.

This report provides the outputs and outcomes of the RideFinders programs and services and the annual budget.

Introduction

RideFinders is a division of GRTC Transit System with the same Governing Board as GRTC, but has separate Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. The Governing Board assists with charting strategic direction for RideFinders and has demonstrated interest in the agency's activities, but does not micromanage tactical day-to-day operations. RideFinders maintains a substantially independent operation within the parameters defined for the agency by GRTC. GRTC provides RideFinders with substantial operational and marketing support in the manner of outside consultants or vendors. Currently, the Bylaws are in the review and revision process.

STAFF:

There are six (6) staff members. This includes: one Executive Director, one program manager, two account executives, one customer relationship specialist, and one client services specialist.

FUNDING:

Funding is provided through the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO) with Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ) funds, the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (VDRPT), the City of Richmond, Chesterfield County, Henrico County, and the Crater Planning District Commission. VDRPT funds special projects at 80% with a required 20% local match.

The TPO has provided consistent financial support with TPO CMAQ and/or Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) funds.




Commuter Store – Walk-In Customers

Snapshot of What We Do:

The Commuter Store located at 1013 East Main Street, Richmond, VA is in the historic Ironfronts building, and is a street level ADA accessible operation in the heart of financial business district. The store serves as a hub for commuters to purchase transit fare media and other items, register for ridematching services, pick-up transit schedules and other activities.

The chart below shows the Commuter Store walk-in customer activity.




There was a total of 6,804 walk-in customers.




Transit Media & Vanpool Voucher Sales

Snapshot of What We Do:

RideFinders sells GRTC transit media (\$10 Go Card, fare passes and CARE tickets for paratransit services) and vanpool vouchers for vanpool riders. The Go Card and fare passes are purchased by individual commuters and by employers enrolled in the Commuter Choice program. The vanpool vouchers are purchased only through employers.

The graph below is representative of credit card sales. Please note these number are also captured in other sales data.




There was a total of \$62,245.66 in credit card sales.

RideFinders utilizes the GreenRide ridematching system to track all registered clients.






GreenRide – New Registered Commuters


There were a total of 1,529 total new commuter registrations for FY16 and a total 1,492 new commuter registrations in FY15. A net increase of 37 new commuters.



GreenRide – Registered Carpoolers & Carpools


Snapshot of What We Do:

GreenRide – Splits by Mode




Mode split of commuters registered in GreenRide database system.

Commuters must log into the GreenRide system and manually record their trips.




There were a total of 2,216 trips recorded in FY16.

The vehicle miles saved is based solely on the commuter trips that are recorded in the system.




There was a total of 114,518.24 vehicle miles saved in FY16.

RideFinders supports the formation and continued operation of vanpools in various ways. RideFinders does not own or operate any vans; maintenance, insurance, fare collection and all other aspects of daily vanpool operations are addressed by third party leasing agencies.






Emergency Ride Home (ERH) Program

Snapshot of What We Do:

RideFinders provides the Emergency Ride Home (ERH) program provides eligible, enrolled commuters who carpool, vanpool, bike or ride the bus to work at least three days a week with a ride home or to their vehicle if an emergency occurs while at work.



In FY16, there were a total of 474 New ERH registrants. There were 131 total ERH trips.



Outreach

Snapshot of What We Do:

The Commuter Choice program permits employers to offer employees a tax-free benefit to commute to work by bus or vanpool via an employer-paid benefit, an employee paid pre-tax benefit, or a share-the-fare benefit. RideFinders has assisted over 52 companies in developing, implementing and maintaining such programs. In addition, RideFinders has enrolled 26 companies in GRTC's electronic swipecard program. Hired Tyler Walter as a part-time planning intern. Tyler is a graduate student at VCU studying Urban Planning. Grant funded position from the VA. Dept. of Rail & Public Transportation.

Marketed the Carpool Program (featuring Commander Carpool), Vanpool (featuring Vanity Vanpool) and Emergency Ride Home (featuring Ride Rescuer) programs on the exterior of 60 GRTC busses. A mix of rear and queen sized ads were used for the month long campaign. Ads run on the busses (gratis) until that ad space is purchased by another organization/company.





Science Matters Sponsorship with WCVE through on-air spots on WCVE PBS, WHTJ PBS & WCVW PBS, Public Radio and on the Science Matters web page. Spots includes the RideFinders name and message followed by: "...proud sponsor of Science Matters." A combination of three (3) credits per week.





Promoted the use and sale of UCI World Championship Special Event passes via website, social media, ETC network and Commuter Store; solicited area businesses and hotels to sell UCI passes; opened Commuter Store for special weekend hours during the races to accommodate the public and provide giveaways; provided GRTC with the RFs mobile unit for use at transfer plaza to sale transit passes.



Hispanic outreach - Medal Sponsor for the 2nd Annual COPA Telemundo Richmond soccer tournament. RFs provided the Mobile Unit and Information Table for attendees. (free radio advertising in Spanish language)



School Outreach: Provided Air Quality information and guides to Ettrick, Tussing, Walnut Hill, Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary schools located in Richmond and the Tri-Cities for Earth Day and Bike to School Day events. Partnered with VDEQ for a presentation for 6th grade weather classes at Oak Knoll Middle School.





Promoted The RFs Bike Challenge, a two-month challenge to employers and the community to discover or re-discover just how easy, healthy and fun bike commuting can be. Participants simply logged their bike trips, including bike trips in combination with transit trips, on their Commute Calendar. Points were awarded throughout the challenge. All of the miles ridden counted towards their total points, no matter what the purpose for travel are, which would make them eligible for weekly prize drawings. However, participants had to earn a minimum of 40 points to be eligible to win a new bike. Partnered with Agee's Bicycles for discounted bike (\$100 off of bike purchase) and bike related items (20% off entire purchase) for the Challenge.
