CROMERR Overview

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What is CROMERR?

- Cross-Media Electronic Reporting Rule
 - Promulgated October 15, 2005. Codified under 40 CFR part 3.
 - Performance-based system standards; both technology and process neutral.
 - Focus is on EPA programs and state, local, and tribal government partners administering EPA programs.
 - Applies to electronic reporting of regulatory information under EPA programs.
 - Industry is not subject; generally a beneficiary of what CROMERR addresses.

Key Benefits of CROMERR

- Ensures that EPA regulatory data collected electronically maintains the same legal integrity as paper submittals by providing common EPA standards for:
 - Establishing a copy of record
 - Integrity of electronic document
 - Opportunity to review and repudiate copy of record
 - Validity of electronic signature
 - Identity management and electronic signature authority
- Reduces barriers to electronic reporting by providing one-stop technical, administrative, and legal advisory services for EPA and EPA-authorized programs implementing e-reporting systems.



Electronic Reporting Process

 Regulated entities report directly to EPA and/or to EPA -delegated programs run by state, tribal and/or local agencies.

CROMERR does not require electronic reporting

- EPA and delegated programs may choose to collect some or all EPA regulatory data electronically.
- EPA and delegated programs design the specifics of their electronic reporting approaches.
- However, these approaches, both systems and related business processes, must comply with CROMERR technology and process neutral standards.
- CROMERR is one of many elements in the implementation of electronic reporting.

EPA CROMERR Program reviews and approves "applications":

 Applications are plans on paper describing how the electronic reporting approach meets CROMERR standards.



CROMERR Implementation

- EPA CROMERR program strives to be a valued partner to EPA programs and co-regulators
 - Stresses customer service.
 - Provides electronic reporting expertise to minimize approval time and save resources.
- A 2013-2016 initiative to improve CROMERR implementation
 - Most applicants are now "automatically" approved with a simple request for EPA action under CROMERR.
 - Expanded technical guidance available to those applicants still pursuing custom-developed solutions.
- As technology has changed, so has program implementation
 - 80 percent of current CROMERR applicants pursue off-the-shelf and shared-service solutions.
 - Many use the EPA Central Data Exchange (CDX) shared services.



CROMERR Shared Services Overview

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Background on CROMERR Shared Services

- Integrated Project Team of 20 States, EPA and ECOS
- Objective: "Define the requirements and policy implications for a shared set of CROMERR Services and Components that could be leveraged by states, tribes, and local governments to achieve CROMERR compliance."
- Four Categories of CROMERR Requirements:
 - 1) Registration and Account Management
 - 2) Identity Management
 - 3) Signature Device
 - 4) Signature Ceremony/Copy of Record



CROMERR Shared Services Benefits

- Provides streamlined functionality to automate manual tasks (e.g., identity proofing).
- Level of integration is determined by the implementer states can use one, many, or all CROMERR services.
- Provides a consistent, standardized approach to CROMERR-compliant electronic reporting to regulated industry.
- Streamlines the CROMERR application and system documentation process.
- Reduces development and implementation costs and timeframes for co-regulators.




