## Public Notice

**DATE OF THIS NOTICE:** June 20, 2017

**PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE:** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision of Corrective Action Complete without Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Crane Chempump facility (Facility) located at 175 Titus Avenue, Warrington, Pennsylvania.

**FACILITY DESCRIPTION:** The Facility is a manufacturer of industrial and custom-made chemical pumps. Their manufacturing includes the design, assembly, painting, and distribution of chemical pumps.

**COMMENT PROCESS:** Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30-day comment period ending July 20, 2017. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed decision. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, Grant Dufficy, as listed above, and must be received prior to July 20, 2017. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

**FINAL DECISION:** EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
