OPERATING PERMIT

In accordance with provisions of the Air Pollution Control Act, the Act of January 8, 1960, P.L. 2119, as amended, and after due consideration of an application received under Chapter 127 of the rules and regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources, the Department hereby issues this permit for the operation of the air contamination source described below.

This permit is subject to the following conditions:

1. That the source and any associated air cleaning devices are to be:
 - a. operated in such a manner as not to cause air pollution;
 - b. in compliance with the specifications and conditions of the Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) plan;
 - c. operated and maintained in a manner consistent with good operating and maintenance practices.
2. This permit is valid only for the specific equipment, location and owner named above.

4. This operating permit constitutes a RACT determination for volatile organic compound (VOC) emissions from specialty tire manufacturing as per 25 Pa. Code, Sections 129.91 and 129.92.
5. Total VOC emissions from all tire manufacturing operations and related activities shall not exceed an average of 0.04 pounds per tire on a monthly basis.
6. The company shall maintain the appropriate daily records to verify compliance with the emission limit in Condition 5 above. These records include production and inventory data and shall be made available to Department representatives upon request.
7. An annual report containing the following data shall be submitted to the Harrisburg District Supervisor:
 - a. identification of each cement and solvent used
 - b. lbs of VOC per gallon of each cement and solvent (less water)
 - c. gallons per month of each cement and solvent used
 - d. lbs per year of VOC emissions from cement and solvent use
8. An annual report containing the following data for all cement and solvent wastes shall be submitted to the Harrisburg District Supervisor:
 - a. gallons per month of waste cements, waste solvents, or mixtures shipped from the facility
 - b. waste profile or sampling data for each shipment
 - c. identification of the waste disposal company for each shipment

The reports required under Conditions 7 and 8 above for each January 1st through December 31st period are due by March 1st of the following year for each year authorized by the permit or its renewal.

9. Material Safety Data Sheets and/or manufacturer's data for each cement and solvent used at the facility shall be maintained at the facility for the most recent two-year period; this information shall be available to Department representatives upon request.
