PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE: The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is announcing its proposed decision that Corrective Action is Complete with Controls under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (RCRA), for the Great Lakes Chemical Corporation Facility (Facility).

FACILITY DESCRIPTION: The inactive Great Lakes Chemical Corporation Facility is owned by Great Lakes Chemical Corporation and located at 200 Pickens Road Nitro, WV. The Facility s over 60 years old and is located on the banks of the Kanawha River, within ten miles of Charleston, West Virginia. FMC owned and operated the Facility between 1950 and July 1999. Great Lakes Chemical Corporation operated the Facility from July 1999 until July 2002 when operations ceased.

COMMENT PROCESS: Persons wishing to comment on EPA's proposed decision must submit comments to EPA within the 30-day comment period ending August 31, 2017. Interested persons may also request a public hearing on this proposed remedy. All comments and/or requests for a hearing must be submitted in writing via mail, fax, or email to the EPA Project Manager, John Hopkins, as listed above, and must be received by August 31, 2017. All comments will be considered in making a final decision.

FINAL DECISION: EPA will make a final decision after considering all comments, consistent with applicable RCRA requirements and regulations. If the decision is substantially unchanged from the one in this notice, EPA will issue a final decision and inform all persons who submitted written comments or requested notice of EPA's final determination. If the final decision is significantly different from the one proposed, EPA will issue a public notice explaining the new decision and will reopen the comment period.
