This plan approval applies to the following sources:

- Nine Cocoa Bean Roasters, Roasters #1-9.
- Eight Breaking Chambers and One Winnower, Breaking Chambers #1 9 (Chamber #6=Lehman Winnower)
- Flavoring Operations (includes: multiple tanks for mixing, holding and cooking syrup)
- Panning Operations (includes: multiple mixers for coating candy)
- Print Shop (includes: two five-color presses, one two-color press and cleanup solvents)

Conditions, Continued

- 5. The permittee shall operate all volatile organic compound-emitting equipment according to manufacturer's recommended operating procedures, where applicable.
 - ^o The permittee shall operate the roasters' burners in accordance with good combustion practices.
- The permittee shall perform routine maintenance on a frequency consistent with manufacturer's recommendations or Hershey Plant's preventative maintenance practices on all volatile organic compound (VOC) emitting equipment to ensure continued operation.
- 7. The permittee shall maintain records of:
 - a. All routine maintenance performed on all VOC emitting equipment.
 - b. Total days and hours of operation for each source.
 - c. Monthly totals of VOCs emitted by each source for any consecutive 12-month period.

The permittee shall maintain these records for a minimum of five years. The records shall be made available to the Department upon request.

- The permittee shall provide the following information for waste coatings, solvents, or mixtures sent
 off-site for recycling or disposal in order to obtain credit for VOC emissions record keeping:
 - a. Pounds or gallons per month of waste solvents or mixtures shipped from the facility.
 - b. Waste profile or sampling data for each shipment.
 - c. Identification of the waste disposal company for each shipment.

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Conditions, Continued

- 9. The permittee shall keep all containers storing VOC material tightly closed when not in use. Spills of materials containing VOCs shall be cleaned up immediately with cleaning cloths or other methods that will minimize the evaporation of VOCs into the atmosphere. Solvent-laden cleaning cloths shall be kept in closed containers when practical and not in use.
- The VOC emissions from the Roasters #1 9 shall remain less than 56 tons of VOC per any consecutive 12 months.
- The VOC emissions from the Panning Operations shall remain less than 27 tons of VOC per any consecutive 12 months.
- The VOC emissions from the Flavoring Operations shall remain less than 25 tons of VOC per any consecutive 12 months.
- The VOC emissions from the Print Shop shall remain less than 20 tons of VOC per any consecutive 12 months.
- The VOC emissions from the eight Breaking Chambers and one Winnower (Breaking Chambers #1 -9) shall remain less than 16 tons of VOC per any consecutive 12 months.
