OPERATING PERMIT

In accordance with provisions of the Air Pollution Control Act, the Act of January 8, 1960, P.L. 2119, as amended, and after due consideration of an application received under Chapter 127 of the rules and regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources, the Department hereby issues this permit for the operation of the air contamination source(s) described below.

This permit is subject to the following conditions:

1. That the source(s) and any associated air cleaning device(s) are to be:
 - a. operated in such a manner as not to cause air pollution;
 - b. in compliance with the specifications and conditions of the applicable plan approval(s) issued;
 - c. operated and maintained in a manner consistent with good operating and maintenance practices.

2. This permit is valid only for the specific equipment, location and owner named above.

Failure to comply with the conditions placed on this permit is a violation of Section 127.444. Violation of this or any other provision of Article III of the rules and regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources will result in suspension or revocation of this permit and/or prosecution under Section 9 of the Air Pollution Control Act.

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3. This operating permit includes sources previously permitted under Operating Permit #08-317-005 and supersedes Operating Permit #08-317-005 with respect to those sources.
4. The expiration date shown on the operating permit is for State purposes. For Federal Enforcement purposes the operating permit shall remain in effect as part of the State Implementation Plan (SIP) until replaced pursuant to 40 CFR 51.4 and approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The operating permit shall become enforceable by the U.S. EPA upon its approval of the above as a revision to the SIP.
5. If at any time the permittee causes, permits or allows any modification (as that term is defined in Chapter 121 of Title 25, the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources) of the aforementioned air contamination source(s), the operation and use of which is authorized by this permit, or causes, permits or allows any modifications, malfunction or removal of any air pollution control device required as a condition of this permit, then and in that event, this permit shall be suspended, and the permittee shall not thereafter continue to operate or use said air contamination source(s).
6. The aforementioned source(s) may be operated and used only so long as any associated air pollution control devices are operated and maintained in accordance with the specifications set forth in the respective plan approval(s), and the application(s) submitted for said plan approval(s) (as approved by the Department), and in accordance with any conditions set forth herein.
7. This operating permit is issued for the operation of the following sources:
 - a. Line 1 prebake processes utilizing the following equipment:
 - sponge mixer
 - fermentation room
 - dough mixer
 - dough divider
 - dough rounder
 - sheeting rollers
 - molder/panner
 - proofbox
 - b. 6 million BTU per hour natural gas-fired burners associated with the Chubco Superflo bread oven.
 - c. Two 1.03 million BTU per hour natural gas-fired donut fryers (Units DCA model MD109 and DCA model MD86), the air contaminants from which shall be controlled by a Ducon model E-7-4-2 electrostatic precipitator.

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- d. 2.70 million BTU per hour natural gas-fired Cyclotherm boiler.
- e. 1.68 million BTU per hour natural gas-fired Columbia boiler.
- f. 1.35 million BTU per hour natural gas-fired Cyclotherm boiler.
- g. Six Videojet brand ink jet printers.
- h. Two cold solvent parts washer sinks.
- i. Facility painting operations.

For the purpose of determining the status of the sources identified above, the sources shall be considered as being within the following source categories:

<u>Sources</u>	<u>Category</u>
7a	prebake steps
7b, 7c, 7d, 7e, 7f	combustion sources
7g	inkjet printers
7h	parts cleaning
7i	painting operations

- 8. The maximum VOC emissions from the prebake steps source category shall never exceed 7.95 pounds per hour on a daily basis (as determined by the Department).
- 9. The maximum VOC emissions from each of the source categories identified as combustion sources, ink jet printers, parts cleaning and painting operations shall never exceed 3 pounds per hour, 15 pounds per day or 2.7 tons per year (as determined by the Department). Any source category whose VOC emissions are within these limits shall be considered de minimus and, as such, need not comply with the RACT provisions of Sections 129.91 through 129.95 of Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources.
- 10. The operation of the two donut fryers described herein shall not at any time result in the emission of particulate matter in excess of the limitations specified in Section 123.13, fugitive air contaminants in excess of the limitations specified in Section 123.1, malodorous air contaminants malodor emissions in excess of the limitations specified in Section 123.31 or visible air contaminants in excess of the limitations specified in Section 123.41, all sections of Chapter 123 of Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources, or in the emission of these contaminants or any other type of air contaminant in excess of the limitations specified in, or established pursuant to,

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any other applicable rule or regulation contained in Article III.

11. The company shall immediately notify the Department of any malfunction of the source(s) or associated air cleaning device(s) which results in, or may possibly be resulting in, the emission of air contaminants in excess of the limitations specified in any condition contained herein or specified in, or established pursuant to, any applicable rule or regulation contained in Article III of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources.
12. This operating permit is valid for a limited period of time and may be renewed before its expiration. Requests for an operating permit renewal must be in writing and must be accompanied by the appropriate permit application processing and annual permit administration fees as specified in Section 127.703 of the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Resources. These fees shall be paid in the form of a check payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania - Clean Air Fund". The request should be made using the appropriate application form and must be received by the Department along with a completed Air Pollution Control Act Compliance Review form no later than February 1, 2000 .

An annual operating permit administration fee is also due pursuant to Section 127.703 no later than February 29, 1996, February 28, 1997, February 28, 1998 and February 28, 1999 . The administration fee is to be submitted with an Annual Operating Permit Administration Fee Transmittal form.
