AMENDMENT NO. 1

MATERIALS TRANSFER AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

ICAHN SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT MOUNT SINAI

AND

**THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR COMPUTATIONAL TOXICOLOGY
UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY**

This "Amendment No. 1 " is entered into by and between Mt. Sinai, ("the Recipient"), and the National Center for Computational Toxicology ("the Provider") of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") under the authority of Title 15, United States Code ' 3710a, et seq. (commonly known as the Federal Technology Transfer Act of 1986).

WITNESSETH:

- A. **WHEREAS**, the Recipient and the Provider executed a Materials Transfer Agreement, effective October 20, 2016 ("Agreement");
- B. **WHEREAS**, the Recipient and the Provider want to amend and supplement the Agreement;
- C. **WHEREAS**, the Recipient and the Provider want to extend the period of performance to allow adequate time for completion of the tasks;
- D. **WHEREAS**, the Provider views its continued cooperation with the Recipient to be in furtherance of the public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties amend and supplement the Agreement as follows:

1. This Amendment No. 1 will allow the Recipient and the Provider to complete the tasks as outlined in Section 4 of the MTA.
2. Paragraph 17 is amended to read: This Amendment No. 1 shall extend the term of this Agreement an additional three years from the original termination date of October 20, 2017, to a new termination date of October 20, 2020. The total duration of this Agreement [from signature date through amendment expiration] will now be three years.
3. All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force and effect.
