REGION 6 – FEDERAL SECURITY PROHIBITED ITEMS LIST

PROHIBITED ITEMS: The items that are prohibited in the facility include any item prohibited by any applicable federal, state, local, and tribal law and/or ordinance, as well as firearms, dangerous weapons, explosives, or other destructive devices (including their individual parts or components) designed, redesigned, used, intended for use, or readily converted to cause injury, death, or property damage. This list applies to all facility occupants, contractors, and the visiting public.

- A. Firearms and Ammunition of any Type: The list of prohibited firearms and projectile weapons includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. Firearms or similar device that expels a projectile through the action of an explosive (unless meeting the exemptions listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - Parts or components of firearms or guns (unless meeting the exemptions listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - 3. BB or pellet guns;
 - 4. Compressed air guns;
 - 5. Antique firearms;
 - 6. Flare guns;
 - Realistic replica or toy firearms (unless meeting the exemptions listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - 8. Spear guns;
 - 9. Starter pistols;
 - 10. Stun guns, cattle prods, dart-firing stun guns, and other electric weapons or controlled devices;
 - 11. Ammunition, shotgun shells or firearm cartridges, black powder, smokeless propellant powder (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d)); and
 - 12. Slingshots.
- B. **Bladed, Edged or Sharp Tools or Implements:** The list of prohibited bladed, edged, or sharp tools, or implements includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. Axes and hatchets;
 - 2. Bows and arrows;
 - 3. Drills, including cordless portable power drills;
 - 4. Ice axes/ice picks;
 - 5. Knives, sabers, swords, daggers, bayonets, and other bladed devices with a blade of more than 2 ¹/₂ inches (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - Razor-type blades such as box cutters, utility knives, and razor blades not in a cartridge, but excluding safety razors (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d)(3));
 - Visitors with knives with a blade of less than 2 ½ inches (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - 8. Saws, including cordless portable power saws;
 - 9. Scissors, metal with pointed tips;

- 10. Screwdrivers (except those in eyeglass repair kits);
- 11. Throwing stars (martial arts).
- C. <u>Club-Like Items and Striking Devices:</u> The list of club-like items and striking devices includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. Baseball bats;
 - 2. Billy clubs;
 - 3. Blackjacks;
 - 4. Brass knuckles;
 - 5. Cricket bats;
 - 6. Crowbars;
 - 7. Golf clubs;
 - 8. Hammers;
 - 9. Hockey sticks;
 - 10. Lacrosse sticks;
 - 11. Martial arts weapons, including nun chucks and kubatons;
 - 12. Night sticks (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - 13. Pool cues;
 - 14. Ski poles;
 - 15. Tools, including, but not limited to wrenches and pliers.

D. Destructive Devices, Explosives or Combustible Chemical Compounds and Mixtures:

The list of destructive devices, explosives, or any chemical compound or mixture that has a property of yielding readily to combustion or oxidation upon the application of heat, flame, or shock includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Blasting caps or detonators;
- 2. Dynamite, nitroglycerin, trinitrotoluene, ammonium nitrate, and others;
- 3. Fireworks;
- 4. Gunpowder;
- 5. Hand grenades, mine, bomb, rocket, missile, pipe bomb, plastic explosives;
- 6. Flares (in any form)
- 7. Realistic replicas of explosives, incendiaries, or similar devices;
- 8. Explosive or expanding gases;
- 9. Gas torches, including micro-torches and torch lighters;
- 10. Fuels, including cooking fuels and any flammable liquid fuel;
- 11. Flammable liquids (i.e. gasoline, turpentine, paint thinner and aerosols) (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d)).

- E. **Disabling Chemicals and Other Dangerous Items:** The list of disabling chemicals and other dangerous items includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. Mace, pepper spray, tear gas gun, or other chemical spray designed for self-defense (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d));
 - 2. Spill able batteries, except those in wheelchairs or similar devices used by a mobility impaired individual;
 - 3. Spray paint (unless meeting the exemption listed in 18 U.S.C. § 930(d)(3));
 - 4. Poisonous gases;
 - 5. Chlorine or chemicals for pools and spas;
 - 6. Compressed gas cylinders;
 - 7. Liquid bleach.
