I'm responding to the advertisement on the newspaper about the bomb pit renewal permit application. A little brief history about Saipan before the war. The Island was discovered by The Portuguese explorer landed on the island on March 6, 1521. The Marianas were officially claimed by the Spain in 1565. The Spanish Era had a tremendous political, social, religious and economic impact.

The propose permit requires sampling of groundwater after 5 years. The CNMI believes that the groundwater data after 10 years shows no contamination and does not need to be done once after 5 years for a 10 year permit. The CNMI believes that the sampling should occur once (1), shortly before or at the end of the permit. Groundwater sampling places a serious economic burden on the CNMI that is not justified by the data that shows no contamination after 10 years. In conclusion of any report would be inconclusive to whether these detections are from the previous or current activities.
