Health impact assessment requires a broad definition of health. These are the definitions we have used in our own work.

Health is more than not being sick. Health is a resource for everyday life—the ability to realize hopes, satisfy needs, change or cope with life experiences, and participate fully in society. Health has physical, mental, social and spiritual dimensions.¹

Health is a product of individual factors (such as genes, beliefs, coping skills, and personal behaviors) combined with collective conditions (factors in the physical, social and economic environment.) The social and economic environment is a major determinant of population health that has not been a focus of most health improvement efforts in Minnesota.²

The purpose of screening is to filter out projects that are either not appropriate or beyond the user's capabilities at this time. Circle one response for each question.
