On August 29, 2016, the Maryland Department of the Environment adopted new regulations and revisions to Maryland's Public Water System Supervision (PWSS) Program. Specifically, Maryland adopted regulations to implement and enforce the Revised Total Coliform Rule.

On February 12, 2017, the Water Supply Program submitted a primacy program revision request to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for review and approval. EPA has reviewed this request and finds that Maryland's revisions are no less stringent than the corresponding Federal regulations. EPA is pleased to inform you that we have tentatively approved these revisions to Maryland's PWSS Program.

EPA has submitted a public notice to the *Federal Register* for publication stating that Maryland's regulations have been tentatively approved. The notice also opens a 30-day comment period during which interested parties can request a hearing regarding EPA's determination. EPA will place newspaper advertisements in the *Baltimore Sun* announcing this decision. If no significant comments are received, EPA's determination on Maryland's regulations will be final and approved at the end of the comment period. We will inform you and your staff of all comments received and any public hearing requests.
