Mitch McConnell threatens weekend work on slowed nominations

Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell warned lawmakers on Monday that the Senate would remain in session until all of the week's pending nominees are cleared. If Democrats employ their typical delaying tactics, that guarantees a weekend session.

"Let me make one thing clear," the Kentucky Republican said. "The Senate's workweek will not end until all of these amply qualified nominees are confirmed."

Six Trump administration nominees are on the Senate calendar this week, including Claria Horn Boom, who was selected to serve as a United States district judge for the Eastern and Western districts of Kentucky.

Democrats have been refusing to agree to shorten the otherwise required 30 hours of debate time on nominees, which has slowed the process and angered Republicans.

A group of senators wants to change the rules to abbreviate the process.

A McConnell spokesman would not say whether he would agree to the change, but McConnell hinted there could soon be an announcement on the matter.

"I'll have more to say on these partisan tactics in the coming days," McConnell said Monday, referring to the time delay imposed by Democrats.

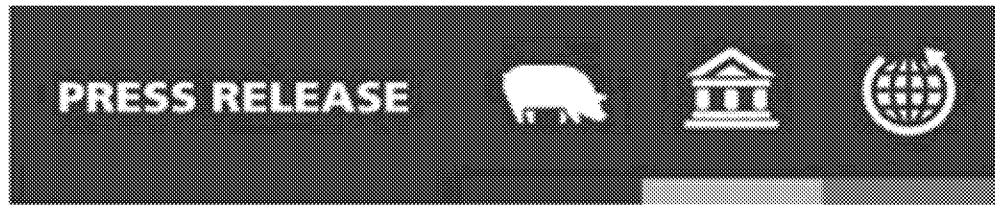

NPPC Wants Votes On Four Key Trump Nominees

WASHINGTON, D.C., Feb. 12, 2018 – The National Pork Producers Council today urged Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., and Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-N.Y., to schedule confirmation votes on four long-languishing Trump administration nominees for positions important to U.S. pork producers and American agriculture.

In a letter to the two leaders, NPPC asked the Senate to fulfill its “vital role in ensuring that our federal agencies are adequately staffed by moving quickly to schedule votes and confirm” Gregg Doud as chief agricultural negotiator at the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, Bill Northey as undersecretary for Farm Production and Conservation at the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Stephen Vaden as USDA’s general counsel and Andrew Wheeler as deputy administrator at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

“All four candidates are highly qualified, and the positions they will fill are extremely important to the U.S. pork industry and American agriculture,” wrote NPPC President Ken Maschhoff, a pork producer from Carlyle, Ill. “The nominees will oversee policies and programs that farmers and ranchers depend on.”

Doud currently is president of the Commodity Markets Council, and he previous was a senior aide to the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry. Doud, who grew up on a family farm in Kansas, also worked for the National Cattlemen’s Beef Association and for U.S. Wheat Associates.

Northey is secretary of the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship. He previously served as president of the National Corn Growers Association and on Iowa’s USDA Farm Service Agency state committee.

Vaden, who has been at USDA since President Trump’s inauguration, grew up on a family farm in west Tennessee before coming to Washington to work at two of D.C.’s biggest law firms.

Wheeler is the co-leader of the energy practice at the law firm Faegre Baker Daniels and formerly served on the staff of Sen. Jim Inhofe, R-Okla., including as the long-time staff director of the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works. He also worked at EPA’s Office of Pollution Prevention and Toxics during both the George H. W. Bush and Bill Clinton administrations.

Nominated in October 2017, his confirmation would provide EPA with the leadership and experience needed as the agency implements its Back to Basics agenda, which is focused on protecting the environment, sensible regulations that facilitate economic growth, and enhanced engagement with state and local partners.

The Chamber urges all senators to support swift confirmation of Andrew Wheeler to be the Deputy Administrator of EPA.

Mr. President:

Hard working Americans whose jobs depend on a strong independent refining industry deserve the opportunity for you to hear directly from their representatives on the potential impact of policies that could kill their jobs and destroy a critical component of our nation's economy. If your administration does not make adjustments or reforms on matters related to the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS), it will result in a loss of jobs around the country, particularly in our states. For example, a recent study found that if U.S. independent refiners go out of business, an estimated 75,000 to 150,000 American jobs are potentially at risk.

Indeed, this week the Wall Street Journal editorial board highlighted the tragic consequences of the EPA's latest actions in this area for Pennsylvanian union workers, many of whom enthusiastically support you. Philadelphia Energy Solutions faces ever increasing RIN prices and last year was forced to lay off 70 workers. Ryan O'Callaghan, president of United Steelworkers Local 10-1, who reportedly has 692 members remaining at Philadelphia Energy Solutions, voiced his fears that they are being left behind.

Mr. O'Callaghan's fears are shared by Americans all across the country, who depend on a strong refining industry for their livelihoods, and who supported Republicans this past year so that they would have a Congress and a President who would stand up for them. But, at the same time, Mr. O'Callaghan expressed hope that you will instead decide to pursue policies that help workers like those at Philadelphia Energy Solutions. We write to you in that same spirit of hope.



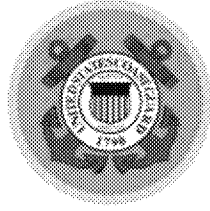

Congressional USCG Jack/St. Malo Visit

Thursday, October 27, 2016

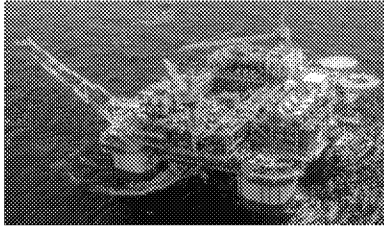
The Jack and St. Malo Fields are approximately 280 miles south of New Orleans, Louisiana and 25 miles apart, in water depths of approximately 7,000 feet. Their reservoir depths are in the order of 26,500 feet. The fields are being co-developed with subsea completions flowing back to a single host floating production unit located between them. It is this floating production unit that the Congressional staff and U.S. Coast Guard officials will visit on October 27, 2016.

The Jack/St. Malo production unit is the largest semi-submersible in the Gulf of Mexico based on displacement. With a planned production life of more than 30 years, current technologies are anticipated to recover in excess of 500 million oil-equivalent barrels. Participants will tour the production unit, learn about the history of oil and gas production in the Gulf of Mexico, and see Chevron's operations firsthand. *Please note attached JSM Fact Sheet.*

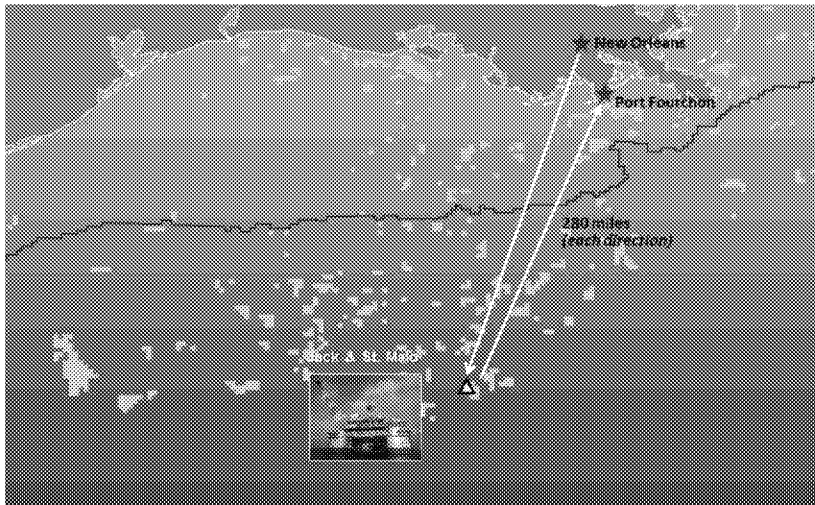
- Jack St. Malo was completed on time and within budget and is the largest semi-submersible platform in the Gulf in terms of displacement. At over 160,000 tons, it has about 1.5 times the displacement of the world's largest aircraft carrier. The facility rests in water depths of approximately 7,000 feet, with reservoirs located 5 miles below the water's surface.
- In June of this year, the production for the Jack St. Malo fields reached 110,000 barrels of oil equivalent per day. At capacity, the facility will process up to 170,000 barrels of oil per day. With a planned production life of more than 30 years, current technologies are anticipated to recover in excess of 500 million oil-equivalent barrels.
- Approximately 200 Texan and Louisianan businesses were involved in the fabrication of equipment and supply of materials for the construction and commissioning of Jack/St. Malo. Jack/St. Malo will continue to deliver sustained community and economic benefits, including jobs creation in Louisiana and along the entire Gulf Coast. It highlights Chevron's long-term commitment to Louisiana and the U.S. Gulf of Mexico.
- Jack/St. Malo demonstrates Chevron's technology leadership. Some of the technology used to develop Jack/St. Malo didn't exist when the fields were discovered – these "game-changing" learnings can now be transferred to other projects.
 - The industry's largest seafloor boost system with respect to combined water depth, pressure, and power rating.
 - Chevron's first application of Ocean Bottom Node seismic technology in the deepwater Gulf of Mexico - giving us an enhanced view of what lies beneath the complex salt layers in Gulf of Mexico.
 - The first open-hole, single-trip multi-zone well completion in deepwater Gulf of Mexico – eliminating the need for multiple entries, a safe, efficient, and cost effective approach.
 - The 136 mile Jack/St. Malo Oil Export Pipeline is the first large diameter ultra-deepwater pipeline in the Walker Ridge area. The combination of extreme water depths (greater than 7,000'), large diameter (24" outer diameter) and high pressure design set new milestones for the Gulf of Mexico).

Chevron will transport the participants by helicopter from Signature Flight Services to Jack/St. Malo and back. The estimated flight time is approximately 2 hours each way. The participants will spend approximately 4.5 hours at the facility. During this time, they will hear a safety briefing, receive personal protective equipment and have the opportunity to see firsthand the overall operations of Chevron's Jack/St. Malo deep water facility. Chevron will provide lunch.

The total estimated cost of the visit is \$20,000, most of which is attributable to transportation. Chevron will report the estimated cost of the visit in accordance with applicable laws.










Chevron holds a 50 percent interest in Jack, a 51 percent interest in St. Malo, and is the operator of both fields. The fields are approximately 280 miles south of New Orleans, Louisiana and 25 miles apart, in water depths of approximately 7,000 feet. Reservoir depths are in the order of 26,500 feet.

The fields are being co-developed with subsea completions flowing back to a single host floating production unit (semisubmersible) located between the fields. Electric seafloor pumps are used to assist production to the host. Production from the first development stage is expected to ramp up over the next several years to a total daily rate of 105,000 barrels of crude oil and 26 million cubic feet of natural gas, with the capability for future expansion. The facility is the largest semi-submersible in the Gulf of Mexico based on displacement. With a planned production life of more than 30 years, current technologies are anticipated to recover in excess of 500 million oil-equivalent barrels.

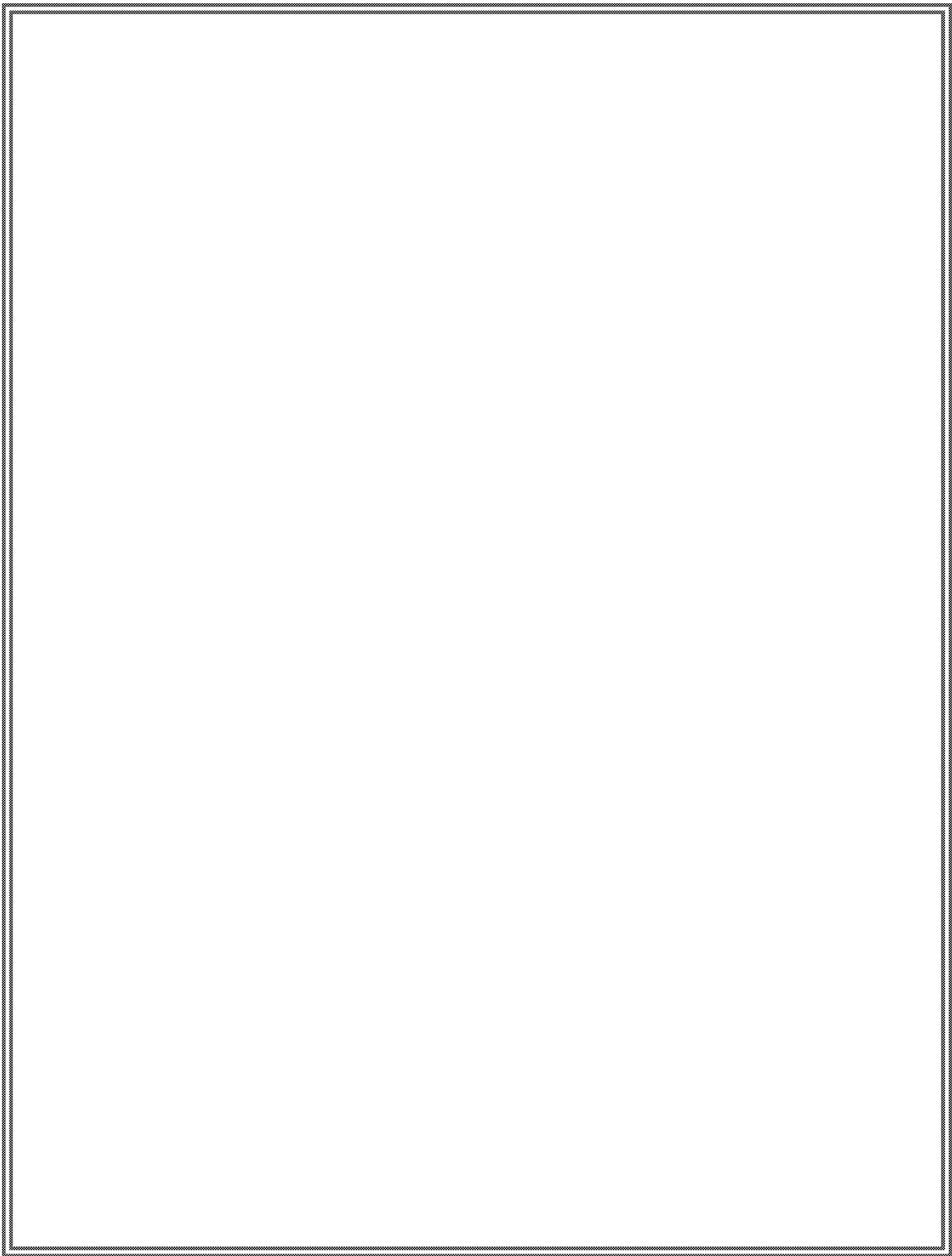

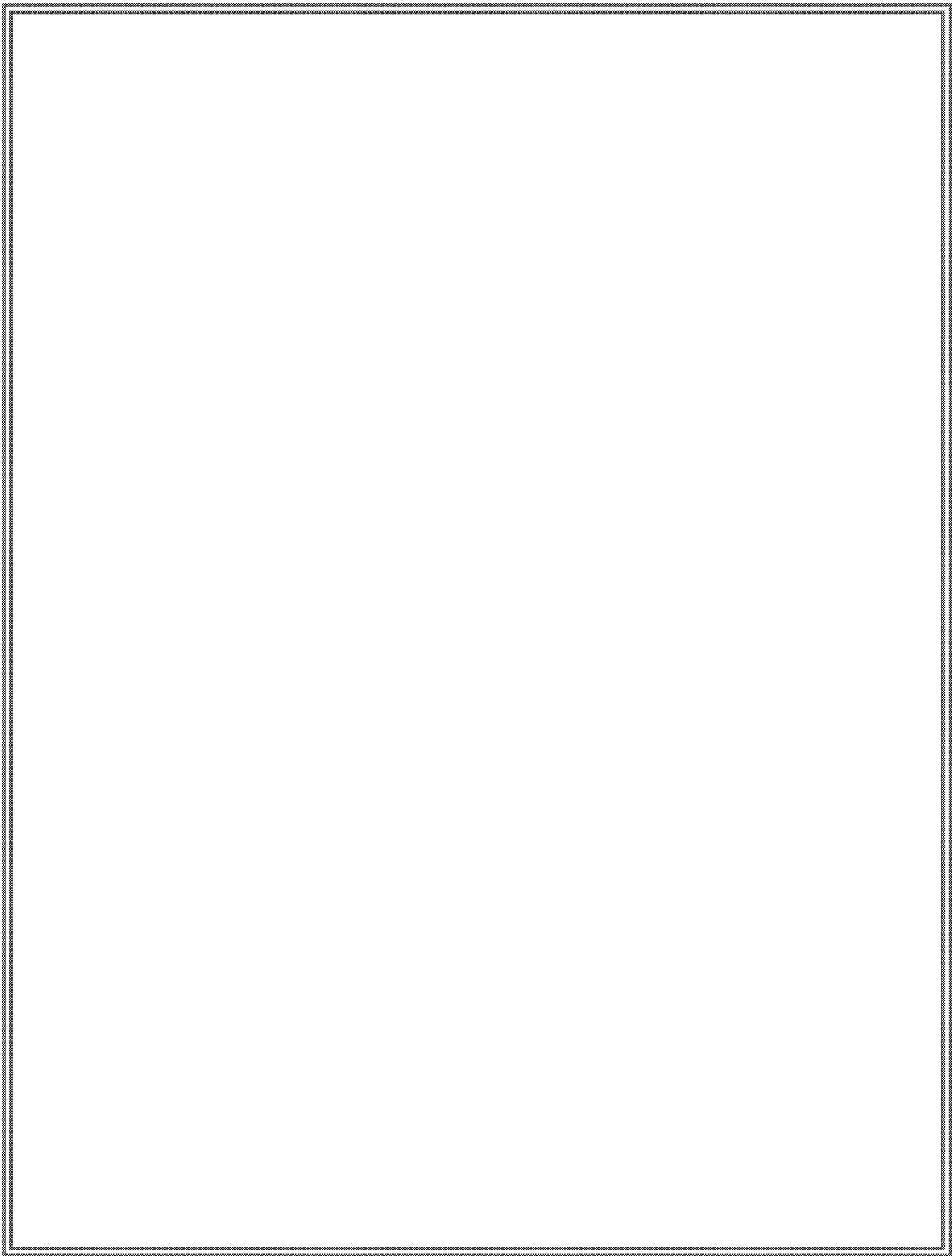

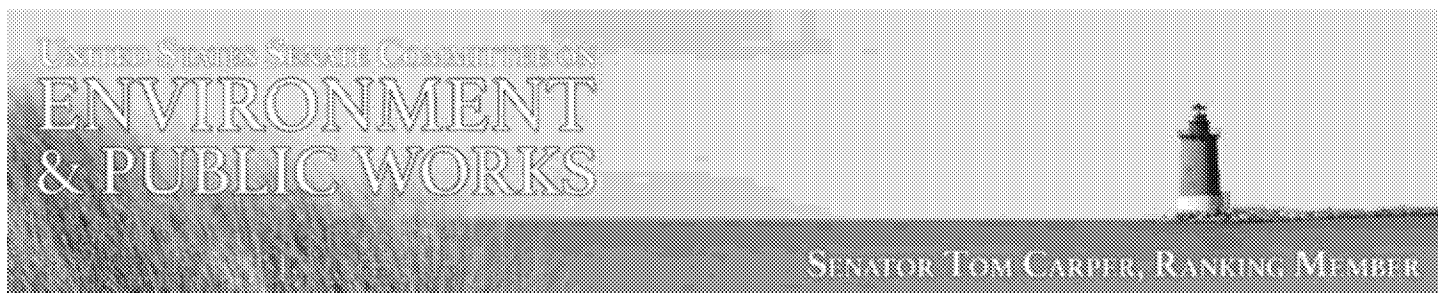

Kathleen Hartnett White, President Trump's pick to serve as his most senior environmental advisor, copied at least 18 responses to questions for the record verbatim from previous nominees, including EPA Administrator Pruitt

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, the minority members of the Environment and Public Works (EPW) Committee called on Kathleen Hartnett White, President Trump's nominee to lead the White House Council on Environmental Quality and serve as his most senior environmental advisor, to submit new and original responses to questions for the record after it was discovered that at least 18 of her responses were copied verbatim from responses previously submitted to the committee. Repeatedly, Ms. White's answers to questions of opinion – on issues including climate change, hazardous air pollutants and environmental justice – matched answers previously provided by President Trump's Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) nominees, including EPA Administrator Pruitt and EPA Assistant Administrator Bill Wehrum.

In a letter led by Ranking Member Tom Carper (D-Del.), the lawmakers wrote, **“We write to request additional information about your responses to questions for the record sent to you by Members of the Environment and Public Works Committee after your confirmation hearing...We are troubled that it appears that you have cut and pasted from the written answers of other nominees in your responses to questions that were submitted to you.”**

The senators requested that Ms. Hartnett White identify and give appropriate citation to all responses that include someone else’s work and submit new answers to each of the plagiarized responses that represent her own views by December 22, 2017.

Senator Carper was joined by Senators Ben Cardin (D-Md.), Bernard Sanders (I-Vt.), Sheldon Whitehouse (D-R.I.), Jeff Merkley (D-Ore.), Kirsten Gillibrand (D-N.Y.), Cory Booker (D-N.J.), Edward J. Markey (D-Mass.), Tammy Duckworth (D-Ill.) and Kamala Harris (D-Calif.).

We write to request additional information about your responses to questions for the record^[1] sent to you by Members of the Environment and Public Works Committee after your confirmation hearing. In at least 18 instances (attached), your responses to these questions included language that also appeared verbatim in responses to questions for the record received from EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt^[2], and EPA’s Assistant Administrator for Air and Radiation, Bill Wehrum^[3].

For example, when asked a question about EPA’s Mercury and Air Toxics (MATS) rule, you stated:

“The quantifiable monetized benefits of the HAP reductions predicted to occur under MATS measured only a few million dollars. I understand that EPA has recalculated the benefits attributable to MATS in response to the Supreme Court remand. I am not familiar with the new estimates and I cannot prejudice any decision that might be made by EPA as it conducts its ongoing review of the rule.”

Mr. Wehrum stated the following in response to a similar question:

“The quantifiable monetized benefits of the HAP reductions predicted to occur under MATS measured only a few million dollars. I understand that EPA has recalculated the benefits

attributable to MATS in response to the Supreme Court remand. I am not familiar with the new estimates. If confirmed, I intend to consider them objectively.”

Similarly, in response to five questions about climate change submitted to you by Senators Merkley, Sanders and Whitehouse, you stated:

“If confirmed, I will work to ensure that any regulatory actions are based on the most up to date and objective scientific data, including the ever-evolving understanding of the impact that increasing greenhouse gases have on our changing climate.”

Mr. Pruitt responded to a similar question as follows:

“If confirmed, I will work to ensure that any regulatory actions are based on the most up to date and objective scientific data, including the ever-evolving understanding of the impact increasing greenhouse gases have on our changing climate. I will also adhere to the applicable statutory authorities to fulfill EPA’s mission to protect human health and the environment consistent with the process and rule of law established by congress. I also believe the Administrator has an important role when it comes to the regulation of carbon dioxide, which I will fulfill consistent with *Massachusetts v. I believe the most effective path towards achieving these objectives is through close partnership with the states granting them regulatory leeway as ascribed by the rule of law.”

1. Please list each response to a question for the record submitted to you by any Member of the Environment and Public Works Committee for which you either plagiarized someone else’s work or that you did not write part or all of the answer yourself.
2. For each item listed in your response to question 1, please list the source or person from which you derived part or all of your response.
3. Please submit a new answer to each such item that represents your own views and effort.

Sen. Tom Carper, top Democrat on the Environment and Public Works Committee, said today that he will force the Trump administration to renominate Kathleen Hartnett White to run the White House Council on Environmental Quality in 2018.

"Unqualified or controversial nominees will not simply be rubber-stamped by the Senate," Carper said in a statement. "Let's start the new year off with a clean slate and allow President Trump the opportunity to nominate a leader for the Council on Environmental Quality who takes environmental laws and public health protections seriously."

Senators typically allow nominees not confirmed by the end of the first year of a congressional term to remain pending without forcing them to be renominated. But Carper said White's controversial views on climate change and other environmental matters means she shouldn't be afforded that courtesy.

That comes as the first Republican senator expressed unease with White's nomination. Sen. Susan Collins told POLITICO she had viewed a clip of her confirmation hearing that "raised a lot of issues in my mind" but said she's not examined her record in-depth.

WHAT'S NEXT: Carper said he plans to object to any unanimous consent motions that would keep White's nomination pending after Congress adjourns for the year. That would force the White House to resubmit the nomination in 2018.

Dear Senators Ernst, Grassley, Roberts, Thune, Fischer, Rounds, and Sasse,

My responsibility as Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is to faithfully administer the laws passed by the U.S. Congress. This Agency must and will respect those laws. When it comes to the broad spectrum of environmental statutes the EPA is responsible for implementing, including the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS), that is exactly what we have done.

The first RFS-related issue I encountered as Administrator was a pending petition requesting this Agency move the “point of obligation” from refiners and importers to blenders. After detailed analysis, numerous meetings with many stakeholders, and review of the over 18,000 comments received, the record demonstrates that granting that petition would not be appropriate. I have directed my staff to finalize this decision within 30 days.

Second, to provide stakeholders the certainty and predictability they need, EPA will meet the statutory deadline to issue a final Renewable Volume Obligation (RVO) rule by November 30, 2017. On July 21, 2017, EPA issued a proposed RVO rule that would require 19.24 billion gallons of biofuel to be blended into the nation’s fuel supply. Of the 19.24 billion gallons, 15

billion gallons would be met through the blending of conventional or corn-based ethanol and the remaining 4.24 billion gallons would be met by blending a combination of advanced biofuels, at least 238 million gallons of cellulosic biofuel, and at least 2.1 billion gallons of biomass-based diesel. While the process for determining the final RVO Rule is ongoing, it would not be appropriate for the Agency to prejudge the outcome of the rulemaking process. Nevertheless, preliminary analysis suggests that all of the final RVOs should be set at amounts that are equal to or greater than the proposed amounts, including at least 2.1 billion gallons for biomass-based diesel in 2018 and 2019.

Key members of Congress have advocated for a nationwide Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) waiver for E15, and other midlevel ethanol blends, so that E15 may be sold throughout the entire year without disruption. Since becoming Administrator, I have directed EPA to actively explore whether it possesses the legal authority to issue such a waiver. The Agency would welcome the opportunity to work with Congress on this important issue, including issuing definitive analysis on the Agency's authority to issue a nationwide RVP waiver for E15.

Finally, the Agency has been discussing a range of ideas intended to stabilize RFS compliance costs. One of these ideas presented to EPA would involve amending our regulations to modify the treatment of Renewable Identification Numbers (RINs) associated with ethanol exports. EPA has not taken any formal action to propose this idea, nor will EPA pursue regulations.

I look forward to continuing to engage in constructive and meaningful dialogue on these and other RFS-related issues. I reiterate my commitment to you and your constituents to act consistent with the text and spirit of the RFS. I take seriously my responsibility to do so in an open and transparent manner that advances the full potential of this program as envisioned by Congress, rural America, and the President of the United States.
