Re: Part 71 Permit # R6OPP71-05 for the Ojito Compressor Station

Dear Mr. Jasek:

This letter in in response to your request dated August 16, 2018, to withdraw the existing title V operating permit [R6OPP71-05] issued under 40 CFR Part 71 for the Williams Four Corners Ojito Compressor Station, Rio Arriba county, New Mexico. The EPA understands that a catastrophic fire on July 18, 2017, destroyed the Ojito Compressors.

You opted to use the minor source federal implementation plan (FIP) for oil and gas sources at 40 CFR § 49.160(c)(iv) to rebuild the Ojito Compressor Station as a minor source. The Endangered Species Act and the National Historic Preservation Act screening procedures, and FIP Registration Form 1 to permit the construction of the new equipment at the facility were submitted on October 3, 2017. The EPA responded on October 17, 2017, authorizing construction under the oil and gas FIP. Further, on March 15, 2018, the EPA received the FIP Registration Form 2 providing the operations, emissions, and equipment data of the new Ojito compressor facility which demonstrate that the total emissions from the new facility will be less than the major source threshold of 100 tpy.

The new facility is operating under the conditions established by the oil and gas FIP and is no longer a major source for title V permitting purposes. Therefore, the EPA, at your request, is voiding the title V permit for the original Ojito Compressor Station that was destroyed by a catastrophic fire incident.
