In addition to a session held in conjunction with the Worldwide ERC® 2013 National Relocation Conference in San Diego, CA and co-hosted with the Southern California Relocation Council, the exam was conducted at 13 other site locations, hosted by Worldwide ERC®-recognized Regional Relocation Groups. Sites included: Charlotte, NC (Charlotte Metro Area Relocation Council); Chicago, IL (Corporate Relocation Council of Chicago); Cleveland, OH (Northeast Ohio Relocation Roundtable); Dallas, TX (North Texas Relocation Professionals & Texas Relocation Network); Denver, CO (Rocky Mountain Relocation Council); Detroit, MI (Detroit Regional Relocation Council); Houston, TX (Houston Relocation Professionals); Pittsburgh, PA (Greater Pittsburgh Relocation Council); Roseland, NJ (New Jersey Relocation Council); Salt Lake City, UT (Inter-mountain Relocation Council); Scottsdale, AZ (Arizona Relocation Alliance); Seattle, WA (Pacific Northwest Relocation Council), and Washington, DC (Greater Washington Employee Relocation Council). Graebel Relocation Services Worldwide also sponsored a closed site in Atlanta, GA.

The CRP® program was introduced in 1990 to formally recognize relocation professionals' knowledge of the U.S. domestic workforce mobility process. There are currently over 3,800 Worldwide ERC® members who hold the CRP® designation. CRP®s retain their designations by maintaining membership in the association and earning 30 recertification credit hours within each three-year period following their initial certification, ensuring they remain current on evolving industry trends.
