Andrew – Thanks for taking the time to meet with us last week. We appreciate your leadership, and all of the good work coming out of EPA.

During our meeting, I mentioned the topic of Clean Water Act Section 401 and how EPA can play a constructive role in improving the 401 process. As follow up, I wanted to let you know that we renewed our request to meet with Dave Ross at OW at his earliest convenience. In addition, at the suggestion of Brittany Bolen, we submitted a request for INGAA to meet with the Administrator. We're eager to continue our conversations with EPA on this topic. If you like, we're happy to bring in the INGAA team, as well as some of its members, to brief you on the challenges associated with Section 401 and other related energy infrastructure topics.

Also, I wanted to make sure that you were aware that in the last week, Congress and the states are starting to become more vocal on this issue. Language on 401 was included in the House FY 2019 Interior and Environment Appropriations report last week (the Cole amendment is attached). In addition, I've attached a letter from the Chairman Richard Barry of the New Hampshire House of Representatives encouraging the Administrator to take action on Section 401. Chairman Barry chairs the Committee on Science, Technology, and Energy, which has primary jurisdiction over the New Hampshire public utility commission and has first-hand knowledge on the need for natural gas infrastructure in New England.

Dear Administrator Pruitt:

I am writing to request the EPA's consideration for providing some much-needed clarity on the scope of states' Section 401 authority under the Clean Water Act (CWA). New Hampshire and other New England states have just weathered yet another winter challenged by volatile and spiking energy prices, grid reliability, reliance on imported LNG and an increased reliance on coal for our electricity needs. Gas supply constraints have made New England the world's most expensive power market. In January, New Hampshire burned more coal than the State of New York despite being 15 times smaller. We continue to be at the end of the energy pipeline and unable to build the capacity needed to meet our demands in part because other upstream states abusing the process and not allowing the infrastructure to even be considered here at the end of the line.

The permitting process is broken, and I respectfully request your assistance to help address the permitting process that has undermined attempts to expand needed natural gas infrastructure in the region. When used inappropriately, Section 401 of the Clean Water Act has become a political tool to frustrate pipeline development projects and to dictate national energy policy. Some states have manipulated the Section 401 water quality certification process to delay and even deny approvals for pipeline projects by putting off consideration of a project's application well beyond the one-year statutory deadline and by expanding the scope of review well beyond federal water quality standards. As the federal agency charged with authority under the Clean Water Act, the EPA must clarify and ensure that Section 401 is used as was originally intended.

In New Hampshire, we believe we have a rigorous process to evaluate if a proposed project meets environmental standards and is in the best interest of our citizens. As outlined in our state's 10-year Energy plan, the most critical infrastructure need is for natural gas capacity which can help incorporate intermittent renewable sources and provide New England with a much-needed reliable baseload. Without additional natural gas pipeline capacity, New England's economy will continue to be plagued by a host of concerns caused by capacity constraints.

I know siting infrastructure is challenging, and we relish the opportunity to consider such projects. The state appreciates the work the EPA does to product our environment and I respectfully ask the EPA to issue guidance on the process to ensure the statutory requirements of timing, waiver and scope are being followed properly to ensure the protection of federal water quality standards. We hope the guidance can provide predictability and prevent any single state from dictating energy policy for all other states further up the supply line.

Amendment to the Interior and Environment Appropriations Bill Offered by Mr. Cole of Oklahoma

On page 57 of the Report, after the paragraph titled "Use Attainability Analysis" insert the following new paragraph:

Water Quality Certification.— The Committee encourages the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to finalize guidance on the implementation of Clean Water Act Section 401 (33 U.S.C. 1341). Such guidance shall reinforce that the statutory time period for review does not exceed one year, that the scope of review is limited to Federal water quality standards, and that waiver of the certification obligation occurs when a State fails to act within one year from the date of application. The guidance shall also include a suggested schedule for a State making a Section 401 decision, which recognizes that the entirety of the State's review must occur within one year.

As discussed, our goal is to create a more effective and efficient national heavy-duty emissions program that will significantly reduce real world NOx emissions.

The Truck and Engine Manufacturers Association (EMA) submitted comments on various regulatory reform options. Below is a summary of the key elements that could be reformed as part of a national heavy-duty on-highway low NOx regulation. Additionally, attached is a document that EMA provided to Assistant Administrator Wehrum in December 2017.

Priorities for Regulatory Reform in a Streamlined Nationwide HDOH Low NOx Rule

There are a number of opportunities for regulatory streamlining and reform, including the following:

- On-board diagnostic (OBD) requirements. CARB's OBD requirements are overly complex and expensive,
 costing each manufacturer more than \$25 million per year (which is a significant percentage of each engine
 manufacturer's annual R&D budget). The OBD requirements could be streamlined by EPA as they only need
 to cover basic diagnostics to ensure the functionality of key emission-control system components.
- Manufacturer-run heavy-duty in-use testing (HDIUT). The current program is expensive, inefficient, and not
 well-suited to the assessment of real-world emissions exceedances. As EPA develops new low-NOx
 regulations, it has the opportunity to develop more cost-effective means of assuring real-world compliance
 and eliminate the HDIUT regulations.
- **Production Line Testing and Selective Enforcement Audits.** These programs are no longer needed and the expense associated with them can be reduced or eliminated.
- **Deterioration Factor (DF) Testing.** This testing, aimed at establishing emission levels at the end of an engine's useful life, is exceedingly time consuming (in months), resource intensive (test cells and test engineers) and expensive (in millions of dollars). Streamlined requirements incorporating accelerated aging methods are necessary in lieu of current DF requirements.
- "Carry-over" engine family certification. Eliminate the need for expensive and unnecessary annual recertification of engine families (where the underlying technology has not changed from one model year to the next).
- Phase 2 GHG regulations. The HDOH industry generally supports the GHG Rule and opposes wholesale changes. However, certain requirements can be eliminated, including the annual chassis-dynamometer testing of five HDOH vehicles, duplicative and costly aerodynamic "coastdown" tests, and burdensome GHG-credit reporting requirements.

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



Re: Fixing the Problems with Renewable Identification Numbers Under the EPA Renewable Fuel Standard

Dear Mr. President:

On behalf of the International Brotherhood of Boilermakers, Iron Ship Builders, Blacksmiths, Forgers and Helpers, I write to express our strong support for reform of the renewable identification numbers (RINs) program as a compliance mechanism for the EPA's renewable fuel standard (RFS). The Boilermakers are proud to represent workers at many of our nation's refineries, important assets to the security, economy and environment of the United States. Unfortunately, in recent years, the extreme price spikes in the RINs program have put intense pressure on refineries, placing thousands of direct and indirect jobs at risk. Workers in Pennsylvania and other industrial states have grown particularly concerned about the unintended consequences of this program.

I was very pleased to hear about the May 9 meeting you convened in order to develop a solution to the RINs problem. As you have previously noted, any workable solution must take into account the protection of refining jobs. In the deal you established, I understand that a critical element would be to allow ethanol exports destined for fuel blending abroad to generate RINs that can provide additional liquidity in the domestic market. By doing so, an important obstacle to RINs exports can be removed, and at the same time, RINs prices can stabilize at a price closer to original predictions made when the EPA launched the program. Achieving both ends is good news for refinery workers and for corn farmers.

Some have suggested that more liquidity in the RINs market could reduce demand for ethanol here at home. From the analysis we have seen, that simply isn't the case. Demand for octane and continued RFS compliance needs will keep domestic ethanol consumption quite strong. Further, the deal you negotiated would also remove obstacles to year-round blending of ethanol in domestic markets – another move that would encourage domestic blending. In addition, the consistent history of RFS has made clear that high RINs prices do nothing to encourage blending, enriching only Wall Street speculators. And as RINs prices have declined, ethanol producers have candidly admitted in their earnings calls that blending has not in fact declined.

Others have suggested that RINs for exports would face legal problems. However, some of the legal experts most familiar with the Clean Air Act have found otherwise, noting that the Agency has a fair amount of flexibility in interpreting the statute. Besides, the explicit RFS policy goals are to "enhance energy security through additional domestic production of biofuels" and to "support rural economies by expanding the demand for agricultural products." RINs for exports does both – enhancing production of

biofuels in support of energy security goals from the energy dominance that flows from exports; and expanding demand by removing obstacles to overseas markets.

Last, some have wondered whether allowing export RINs would violate our trade obligations. Frankly, given the number of agricultural subsidies that exist, we think this position is disingenuous at best. The reality is that your proposal would remove an obstacle to exports, essentially treating exports exactly the same way that ethanol imported into our country is treated under the RFS. From a trade perspective, I cannot imagine why anyone would tolerate the current system, which discourages exports while encouraging imports.

Mr. President, thank you for the agreement you negotiated on May 9 and for the continued interest you have shown in addressing the RINs situation. Only by committing to formalizing and implementing the export RINs concept can we bring an end to a RINs program that currently endangers thousands of jobs, enriches speculators, and perpetuates a fundamental unfairness to the hardworking men and women who the Boilermakers represent in many of our nation's refineries.

During our meeting, I mentioned the topic of Clean Water Act Section 401 and how EPA can play a constructive role in improving the 401 process. As follow up, I wanted to let you know that we renewed our request to meet with Dave Ross at OW at his earliest convenience. In addition, at the suggestion of Brittany Bolen, we submitted a request for INGAA to meet with the Administrator. We're eager to continue our conversations with EPA on this topic. If you like, we're happy to bring in the INGAA team, as well as some of its members, to brief you on the challenges associated with Section 401 and other related energy infrastructure topics.

Also, I wanted to make sure that you were aware that in the last week, Congress and the states are starting to become more vocal on this issue. Language on 401 was included in the House FY 2019 Interior and Environment Appropriations report last week (the Cole amendment is attached). In addition, I've attached a letter from the Chairman Richard Barry of the New Hampshire House of Representatives encouraging the Administrator to take action on Section 401. Chairman Barry chairs the Committee on Science, Technology, and Energy, which has primary jurisdiction over the New Hampshire public utility commission and has first-hand knowledge on the need for natural gas infrastructure in New England.
