The proposed projects will address critical improvements to the comprehensive water distribution system. The purpose of the projects is to improve the reliability and performance of the water distribution system, which provides direct public health benefits such as improved drinking water quality and reduction of water borne diseases.

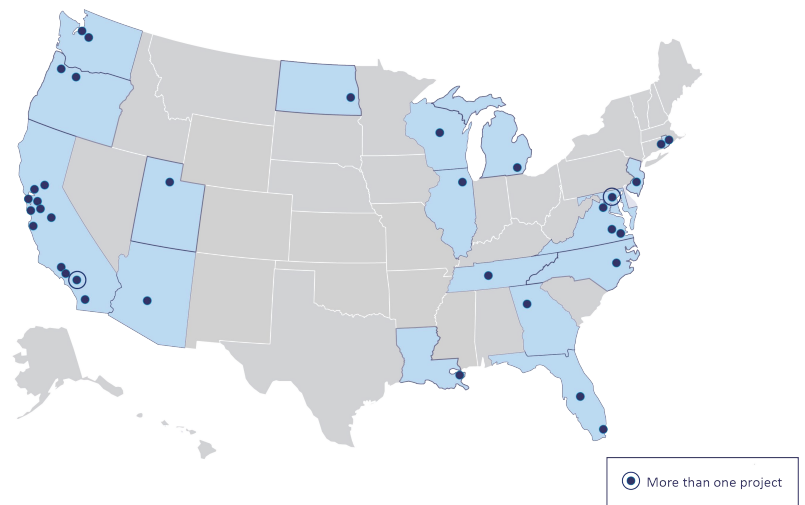
## FY 2019 SELECTION ROUND

**NUMBER OF PROJECTS SELECTED:** 38

**TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT:** \$6.3 billion to public and private entities

**TOTAL WATER INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT SUPPORTED:** \$12 billion

**NUMBER OF PEOPLE IMPACTED:** 24 million in 18 states



Selected projects must submit an application for a WIFIA loan, pass a creditworthiness assessment, negotiate a mutually agreeable term sheet, and execute a credit agreement to receive WIFIA funding. An invitation to apply indicates that EPA believes the selected projects will be able to attain WIFIA loans.



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
