### **PROJECT DESCRIPTION:**

The Basins 2 and 3 Collection System Improvements Project will improve the City's sanitary sewer collection system by replacing and upgrading aging lift stations, sewer mains, and manholes, and constructing a new wastewater flow equalization facility. The primary purpose of the project is to meet the regulatory requirements, eliminate waste discharges, and correct conditions that cause sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs). The project will increase the collection system's capacity to contain and manage higher flows during wet weather events and prevent the discharge of partially treated water into the San Francisco Bay and backups resulting in SSOs.

Selected projects must submit an application for a WIFIA loan, pass a creditworthiness assessment, negotiate a mutually agreeable term sheet, and execute a credit agreement to receive WIFIA funding. An invitation to apply indicates that EPA believes the selected projects will be able to attain WIFIA loans.



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
