Muskegon Lake AOC Kathy Evans, West Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission



Saw Mill and Industry-Filled Shoreline Areas Nearly 50 sawmills left wooden piers, slabwood, bark and sawdust in and around Muskegon Lake. Dozens of foundries followed the disposal pattern with spent sand and slag. Meanwhile, downtown urban renewal resulted in demolition materials to armor the eroding shoreline with broken concrete, bricks and rubble.










Muskegon Lake lost nearly 20% of its surface area, open water and wetlands because of the filling that occurred over the course of 75+ years












Muskegon Lake Watershed Partnership

A MLWP Volunteer Program


How it works:

- Muskegon Lake Shoreline Stewards Face Book Group (Umbrella Group)
- A "lead" volunteer (Shoreline Steward) "adopts" a restored habitat site and oversees a "Friends" FB Group
- The "MLWP Shoreline Stewards FB Group" provides outreach (volunteer recruitment, field sessions)
- Each "Friends of Group" is connected with the MLWP Shoreline Stewards (for networking, hosting their own "pop up" habitat maintenance sessions)


