







National Water Program Tribal Measures

The National Water Program evaluates the progress it is making in developing and implementing effective programs to monitor, protect, and improve the waters of the United States. As part of this effort, seven tribal measures are being tracked. This document presents the results of these measures for FY 2014 through FY 2019.

1. Number of Community Water Systems out of compliance with Health Based Standards in Indian Country. Tracking for this measure began in FY 2018.







3. Number of American Indian and Alaska Native homes provided access to safe drinking water in coordination with other federal agencies (cumulative).




4. Number of American Indian and Alaska Native homes provided access to basic sanitation in coordination with other federal agencies (cumulative).

7. Percent of 'person months' (i.e., all persons served by community water systems times 12 months) during which community water systems in Indian country provide drinking water that meets all applicable health-based drinking water standards.
