These concerts were possible thanks to a contribution and matching funds made by the Titín Foundation.



We facilitated workshops/concerts in the elementary schools Jaime Rosario Benítez, Emilio del Toro Cuevas, Juanita García Peraza, Santiago Iglesias Pantín, Sofía Rexach, Moisés Meléndez, Manuel Boada and Haydee Rexach respectively. Almost 300 children enjoined the concerts of featured water-themed music, mainly passages from Vivaldi's "The Four Seasons" and Handel's "Water Music."



The musicians engaged the students in short conversations about the importance of keeping nearby bodies of water clean, how many entities are working toward cleaning their nearby channel, and how the wood and materials used to make their instruments came from nature.

The students responded amazingly to the concerts, especially to the parts where familiar tunes were played, and when they got to touch and play the musicians' instruments at the end of each concert.

Thanks to the donation and matching funds made by the Humanities Foundation; and the help of the Environmental Protection Agency, Universidad Interamericana, and the Martin Peña Channel ENLACE Project we will publish a book about our Oral History Project during 2016.

The publication will feature dozens of life stories of people who have resided in communities around the Martín Peña Channel in the past six decades. Their stories structure the memory of working and struggling communities that make up our estuarine areas.

In addition, as part of the commitment of SJBE to the Martin Peña Channel communities and a budget of US \$ 9,600.00, we have hired the young community leader Melba Ayala in our Visitor Center. She works as a guide to the exhibition and is an excellent resource as a liaison between the SJBE and other community leaders.

Future Projects



The Iniciative for and with the Martin Peña Channel Continue:

1. Currently, our educational team are editing and designing an educational guide on the most important issues in the Channel problems. The objective is to complement the educational mission of the Visitors Center.

2. Thanks to funds donated by the NY Community Trust we will be able to do an inventory of adaptation to climate change in the Martín Peña Channel communities.

3. As an initiative of continuous effort and projection in the short, medium and long term , we approach the field project to improve green infrastructure in the Channel.

4. At this moment we are working in the documentary about the urban sounds in the Martín Peña Channel, that will be produced by our communications team and released in may 2016. This audiovisual resource will help us continue the educational process and the integration of art with our effort to provide social and environmental justice in the estuarine area.
